For the Crossword Puzzle-hints/phrases will be given for the words to fill in the spaces up & down. For the Word Find-the words will be highlighted for each Sunday.



PARISH NURSE NOTES

Greetings to you all! It's during these very uncertain times of trying to stay away from people that makes me realize how much I need to be close to others to feed my soul and thrive! However now, more than ever, we need to remain diligent regarding what one article referred to as "The Three W's to Ward off COVID-19: Wearing a mask, Washing your hands, and Watching your distance." Still skeptical? I'd like to focus on mask wearing and why it's so very important. I found excellent information on the how and why regarding masks online at a University of California - San Francisco site and I'd like to share some excerpts:

If we're practicing social distancing, do we still need to wear masks?

Of all the recommendations we hear about preventing virus transmission, the most important thing is wearing a mask. Dr. George Rutherford, epidemiologist at UCSF was quoted as saying, "Compared to wearing a mask, cleaning your iPhone or wiping down your groceries are just distractors. There is little evidence that contaminated surfaces are a major source of transmission, whereas there is <u>A LOT</u> of evidence of transmission through inhaled droplets. If you had to chose between wearing a mask or social distancing, I think mask wearing is more important."

Does the type of mask matter?

Studies have compared various mask materials, but for the general public, the most important consideration may be comfort. The best mask is one you can wear comfortably and consistently. The bottom line is that any mask that covers the nose and mouth will be of benefit. "The concept is risk reduction rather than absolute prevention," said Infectious Disease specialist, Dr. Peter Chin-Hong. "You don't throw up your hands if you think a mask is not 100 percent effective. That's silly. Nobody's taking a cholesterol medicine because they're going to prevent a heart attack 100 percent of the time, but you're reducing your risk substantially." However, experts cautioned against using N95 masks with valves (commonly used in construction to prevent the inhalation of dust) because they do not protect those around you. These one-way valves close when the wearer breathes in, but open when the wearer breathes out, allowing unfiltered air and droplets to escape.

Do masks protect the people wearing them or the people around them?

"I think there's enough evidence to say that the best benefit is...to protect people from giving COVID-19 to other people, but you're still going to get a benefit from wearing a mask if you don't have COVID-19," said Dr. Chin-Hong. Masks can prevent larger expelled droplets from evaporating into smaller droplets that can travel farther. Dr. Rutherford also noted that you could still catch the virus through the membranes in your eyes, a risk that masking does not eliminate.

I hope this has perhaps answered some of your questions about the big push for mask wearing; it's a most valuable way to love and protect our neighbors during this time. I feel certain Jesus would be wearing a mask!

Is there anybody out there who knows their way around recording technology and YouTube? There are a handful of Peace members who would like to watch our on-line worship services but they don't have internet, don't own a computer, or their facility has no way of getting YouTube on a TV for them. I'm not sure if this can even be done, but if anyone out there would know how to get PLC's recorded services copied on to a disc so that it could be played in a DVD player, please let me know. (We could pay for any incidental costs needed for this process.) How grateful they'd be if those who long to see the video services could view them on their TV! Please contact the church if you have any insight into this. The person who can come up with a way to do this would be the summer's MVP of our church, that's for sure!

At this point, there is much to consider when it comes to contemplating resuming indoor church services. We've formed a task force of individuals to examine just what this may look like and when it can happen. This committee will be meeting at the end of July, so stay tuned for updates....




