One Simple Act

Easter is a time of hope and promise for Christians around the world. A time for Christians to celebrate the triumph of hope over despair and the forgiveness of our sins.

While it seems that Christmas and Easter are times when we feel the closeness of Christ through religious celebrations, we must never forget that one of the ways for us to feel that closeness all year long is through prayer. This simple act which requires nothing but us reaching out to God, can provide a peace which surpasses all understanding.

As we look towards the cross through the death and resurrection of Jesus, let's take a few moments to ponder how we can find comfort this season through prayer.

Prayer is our communication with God: Prayer is a way to communicate with God, a direct communication with our God who loves us unconditionally and listens to us, even when we feel no one else does.

Prayer strengthens our faith: Prayer helps to deepen our faith and trust in God. As a ritual, prayer reminds us to seek and listen to God's guidance in our lives - during the good times, the bad times and the times when we feel no one would understand.

"Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Philippians 4:6-7

Prayer provides intercession: While we often hear the saying "pray about it" - do we really stop and do so - or is it just a passing thought? Prayer is important for interceding on behalf of others at times when we know that prayer is the only thing we can do for our loved ones, our neighbors, our community or the world.

Prayer gives us a time to simply give thanks: By giving thanks through prayer, we take the time to acknowledge God's goodness and express our appreciation for His grace and mercy.

This Easter I challenge you all to add a little more prayer into your lives. The next time someone crosses your mind, say a short prayer for them. When you are driving down the road and a stranger catches your attention, say a short prayer for them. When the turmoil in the world leaves you feeling helpless, say a short prayer. When you wake in the morning, take a sip of coffee or simply sigh, say a little prayer.

Whether intentional time is taken for prayer or just a quick moment, it can all make a difference in our daily lives and our relationships with ourselves, others and our God. Prayer really can do more than we realize. We just never know where God may lead us to action, in ways we never thought of before.



PARISH NURSE NOTES

Scams and fraud targeting seniors are on the rise and always changing. Join the ADRC of Northwest WI and the Veteran Service Offices of Polk and Burnett counties along with Jeff Kersten of the *Wisconsin Bureau of Consumer Protection* in learning about how to protect yourself. The speaker will discuss the details of common scams that target seniors, the warning signs of a scam, and what to do if you or someone you know falls victim to a scam or fraud. Info sheets that I ordered to put up during National Nutrition Month (March) were delayed in getting mailed to me, so you'll be seeing some of these educational signs up now through April.

CENTERING (Definition: The act of quieting oneself – to be present in the moment and to feel at peace.) A few years back Portico Benefit Services (the insurance company used by the ELCA) put out a program focusing on health and wellness by choosing three small concepts to encourage congregations to start on the road to healthier living. They primarily focused on:

- 1) physical movement,
- 2) what we eat
- 3) clearing our minds or centering

They chose the above three practices because a large percentage of us don't exercise enough, don't eat well enough, and feel emotional stress. I've talked about getting more movement and eating healthier before, but what about this centering? Centering is the effort to clear our minds of stray thoughts and set aside the typical anxieties that wander through our minds – usually about things that have happened or things that may happen. (I know I could benefit from this!) Using a time of silence to quiet our minds and relax our bodies, even for as little as 30 seconds, can help still our emotions and allow us to focus more calmly on the tasks at hand.

I think this is also an important aspect of living in a faith community. When we practice centering routinely, we are more likely to be at peace throughout the day and better equipped to pass on our faith. So why not try it? In our upcoming worship services, take a moment to pause and breathe evenly. Have your feet flat on the floor, sit up tall, lower your gaze and take a deep breath in and slowly exhale. (And it goes without saying to have your cell phone on silence and out of sight!) Try this before prayers, during Holy Communion, or whenever feels right to do so.

Happy Easter! Happy Spring (soon please!) Happy return of Pastor Melissa! It promises to be a month full of joy and celebration, *Karen*

A Message From Your Stewardship Ministry

"You bless everyone who lives in your house, and they sing your praises." Psalm 84:4.

We at Peace Lutheran have truly been blessed by the building we occupy. We are thankful for the vision and commitment of those who saw fit to establish and add to our facility; our commitment has fostered the preaching of God's Word, the education and inspiration of new disciples, and the serving of those in need in our community, our country, and the world.

Recent economic changes have increased the interest cost for the mortgage we have arranged to pay for our building. As you may remember, we have locked into a fixed rate loan that has mitigated the effect of rising interest rates, but the higher rate has increased the length of time before our loan will be paid in full.

"Lord, you are great and powerful. Glory, majesty and beauty belong to you. Everything in heaven and on earth belongs to you."

1 Chronicles 29:11

Your Stewardship Ministry, with the concurrence of your Church Council, believes that we are being called by God to make extra principal payments on a regular basis, so that we can shorten the duration of our loan, save thousands of dollars in interest payments, and establish new and/or enhanced ministries supported by the budget dollars that now go to our mortgage

We invite you to imagine what we could do with the \$7,160 per month now budgeted for mortgage payments. Would additional staff positions or hours improve our education and outreach services? Would additional support for benevolence partners enhance their ministries? Would improvements to our facility enhance our worship experience and attract more of those who are called to a closer walk with Jesus in a Christian community?

We have established a goal of paying an additional \$50,000 per year in principal for the next three years. Your Council has committed \$12,000 per year toward this goal from daycare rent income, and we ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your regular giving to provide the additional amount needed to reach our goal. We encourage you to involve your family in this effort, and to be creative in determining how to intentionally and sacrificially make room in your budget for these additional gifts. No gift is too large, and no gift is too small; as Jesus points out to His disciples, "....from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked." Luke 12:48b. We are planning a social event later this spring with time and space for sharing methods that will make this giving easier.

Our calculations tell us that achieving this goal will result in the duration of our mortgage being reduced from nearly eleven years to less than five years. Please feel free to contact any of us with questions or concerns about this effort. And begin to imagine the celebration when our goal is reached!
