From Pastor Melissa's desk,

#### The Power of Light

For as long as I can remember, we've had a single nightlight in the hallway. When I was younger, there was one in the hallway just outside my bedroom on the way to the bathroom. Now that I'm grown and have my own house, we still have one single nightlight in the hallway, just outside all the bedrooms in our upstairs hallway. And that single nightlight can make all the difference.

When my kids were babies and would cry in the night, that light led me safely to their rooms.

When my kids were toddlers and would feel sick in the night, that light led me to care for them.

When my kids were a bit older and would wake up from a nightmare, that light would lead them to my room, where they would find comfort and solace.

That light doesn't turn night into day, but it gives just enough light so no one trips, stubs a toe, or feels afraid walking to the bathroom at 2 a.m. It's nothing fancy, and it's not that bright, but that one small light provides security far bigger than its size.

And that's the power of light in our everyday lives. We don't always get big, dramatic flashes of God's presence. More often it's the tiny glimmers—the encouraging text from a friend, the kindness of a stranger, a moment of calm in a chaotic day—that are just enough to help us keep going. Light doesn't have to be overwhelming to make a difference. It just has to show up.

December has a way of awakening hope with light. The days grow shorter, and the world turns colder, and yet we gather—Sunday after Sunday—to light candles that insist on shining. Hope. Peace. Joy. Love. These are not sentimental ornaments we hang for a season; they are practices. They are quiet rebellions against despair. They are the heartbeat of our waiting.

This Advent, I invite you to slow down. Sit with the candles a little longer. Experience the Light. Let the hymns wash over you. Notice where Christ's light meets you—in a child's wonder, in a neighbor's generosity, in the courage to face another day. And as Christmas arrives, may the promise of "God with us" settle deeply into your bones. Christ does not wait for us to get everything right; Christ comes right into the middle of our messy living, bringing love that refuses to let go.

As we turn the calendar to January, we carry that same light into a new year. We don't know what 2026 will hold, but we do know who holds us. So we keep lighting candles. We keep showing up. We keep trusting that Emmanuel walks ahead of us and beside us, one step at a time.

Blessed Advent and Merry Christmas, dear church. May Christ's light guide your path and warm your spirit in the days to come.

#### 1. Peace Lutheran Church Assumes Responsibility for St. Peters Cemetery

Peace Lutheran Church now owns and is responsible for the care and maintenance of St. Peters Cemetery in Dresser, WI. The previous volunteer committee was ready to step down, prompting them to ask if Peace Lutheran would assume management. The proposal was enthusiastically accepted by the Church Council, Property Committee, and Cemetery Committee, recognizing the historical connection as St. Peters was a founding church of Peace Lutheran. Many members have family interred there. The transition has been communicated through announcements in the Osceola Sun and the Yellow Advertiser, updated signage at the cemetery, and letters to all known contacts. Thanks to the previous committee's diligent financial management, the associated fund is fully funded, and the acquisition will not pose a financial burden to Peace Lutheran Church.

#### 2. New Loop Road Completed at Peace Lutheran Cemetery

The road expansion project at Peace Lutheran Cemetery is complete. The new design features a loop that significantly improves vehicle flow and accessibility, addressing previous traffic and parking issues during funerals and busy visiting times. The project was fully funded by the Peace Lutheran Cemetery Committee through the sale of cemetery plots and did not impact the church's operating budget.


