Let us celebrate how Summer ministry opportunities have allowed us to be better and stronger together as one church family:

12 youth and adults ventured to the North Shore, MN and made an impact on many lives through service learning projects.

Through the Congregational Lead Initiative Program, we were able to provide an event to bring the community together and uplift our local service workers at our Touch a Truck Event, in which over 250 people attended.

Funerals, a wedding, baptisms, an Eagle Scout ceremony, baby showers, and more were abundant this summer. What an honor to celebrate these aspects of life as a body of Christ and invite visitors in to celebrate with us!

Men's Bible study groups, Women's Bible study groups, a Facebook Bible study group, and Circles meet weekly and monthly to engage in God's Word and Discipleship together.

Twenty-eight Peace Members and community members came together to sew and make kits for Little Dresses for Africa.

Over 20 Children, Youth, Adults & Grandparents attended Luther Point Bible Camp this summer as campers and counselors!

Our Stewardship Committee hosted Christmas in July and have started important congregation conversations about giving of our time, talents and treasures.

### Getting Ready for Sabbatical...

In September of this year, I begin my 7th year of ministry at Peace Lutheran and per ELCA guidelines, I am eligible to take a 3 month Sabbatical during the 7th year. Council has approved for my Sabbatical to take place in 2023. This is not new to Peace, as Pastor Wayne took a few sabbaticals during his called 35 years. Following is some more information about Sabbatical Rests and why they are encouraged and important in ministry:

From NSWI ELCA Synod Guidelines: *“To encourage the congregational health that comes with longer tenured leaders, congregations grant a sabbatical leave for rostered leaders at least every seven years of service, with a minimum length of three months in the seventh year.”*

From National Clergy Renewal Program: *“[Sabbatical Time] provides opportunities for pastors to step away briefly from the persistent obligations of daily parish life, and to engage in a period of intentional renewal and reflection. Renewal periods are not vacation times. They are spaces created for spiritual exploration and reflection, for drinking again from God’s life-giving waters, for regaining enthusiasm and creativity for ministry.”*

Peace Council and I will share more information and updates on details of my sabbatical each month here in the newsletter, as well as through Sunday/worship announcements. We look forward to experiencing the blessings that Sabbatical time offers to both myself AND Peace Lutheran Church.

# PARISH NURSE NOTES

---

**988 is now available.** After two years of planning, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and the Wisconsin Lifeline are prepared to manage mental health emergencies. The **988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline** provides care and support to people experiencing stressful situations—whether that involves thoughts of suicide, a mental health concern, or a substance use issue. This free and confidential service is available 24/7. Wisconsin-ites of all ages who need help for themselves or a loved one can connect with Wisconsin Lifeline, an in-state support center where counselors answer requests for help. The **988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline** can be accessed by:

- Calling 988 (multiple languages).
- Sending a text message to 988 (English only).
- Using the chat feature at [988lifeline.org](https://988lifeline.org)

## More About **988**:

- The counselors at Wisconsin Lifeline are trained to listen and support people through their distress with a focus on de-escalation and coping skills. They also can connect people with local resources.
- Use of the **988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline** is available at no cost to Wisconsin residents. Additional care or intervention that may result from contact with the Wisconsin Lifeline may come with a cost.
- Wisconsin Lifeline is not able to send an in-person response directly. An in-person response requires transfer to another service and could involve law enforcement.
- Calls, texts, and chats with Wisconsin Lifeline are kept confidential between the person and counselor, unless there is imminent danger for the person or others.
- Because 988 is so new, their focus right now is making sure the system is working as designed and that people and organizations providing mental health and substance use resources (counselors, schools, etc.) understand how the service fits into the overall care for behavioral health services in our state.

**Mental Health and Substance Use Recovery Conference.** Speaking of mental health, on October 20<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> there's a virtual or in-person conference on Mental Health and Substance Use Recovery being held at the Kalahari Resort and Convention Center in Wisconsin Dells. This event is organized by UW-Stevens Point and is the state's largest annual event focused on a full range of behavioral health care including prevention, harm reduction, intervention, treatment and recovery services. At the Welcome Center I have put out some blue and white booklets entitled ***The Wisconsin Senior Guide***, which focuses on consumer protection for Wisconsin senior citizens. Help yourself to this easy-to-understand resource that covers multiple types of scams from sweepstakes to investment seminars to charitable solicitations. Learn what the terms Phishing and Spoofing mean and how to protect yourself against all of it! # STEWARDSHIP NOTES

*"But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of His mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out upon us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, **so that**, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs, having the hope of eternal life."*

Titus 3: 4-7, New International Version

English teachers among us will no doubt appreciate Paul's use of conjunctions in his writing style. In this passage, as Paul makes clear to Titus the ministry work that Titus is to do on the island of Crete, Paul restates the loving, grace-filled acts of God as He saved us; Paul then states the results of God's grace in our lives.

As we ponder the magnitude of this gift, it should be clear to us that we should respond with gratitude by living lives of commitment, service, and especially generously sharing our time, talent, and treasure, **so that** others can become heirs and receive this precious hope.

As Paul further instructs Titus in verse 8, "...and I want you to stress these things, **so that** those who have trusted in God may be careful to devote themselves to doing what is good."
