PULPIT SUPPLY PASTORS

PARISH NURSE NOTES

As much as we don't want to believe it, the **coronavirus** is still spreading in certain communities in our region, especially after many people gathered together over the holidays. Here are a few reminders and current recommendations to aid in clarifying exactly what one should do if they expect they have the virus, have tested positive with a home test, or have been around someone who becomes sick with COVID:

Quarantine and stay away from others if you have been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19. A **close contact** is someone who was less than 6 feet away from an infected person (positive test confirmation) for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24 hour period. **Isolate** when you are sick <u>or</u> when you have COVID, even if you don't have symptoms. While isolating at home, as much as possible, stay in a specific room and away from other people and pets in your home. Regardless of your vaccination status, if you test positive for COVID or have symptoms, isolate for <u>at least 5 days</u>. After 5 days, you may end your isolation <u>if</u> you are fever-free for 24 hours (without fever-reducing medication) and your symptoms are improving. **Do not travel** until a full 10 days after your symptoms began or the date your positive test was done if you had no symptoms. When coming out of isolation or quarantine, it's a good idea to wear a mask for a few more days when around vulnerable people who have underlying risk factors. And it's never too late to get the recommended COVID booster shot!

Get healthy with EAT SMART, MOVE MORE, WEIGH LESS. The Aging and Disability Resource Center of Northwest Wisconsin (ADRC) is offering a new wellness initiative beginning in February. *Eat Smart, Move More, Weigh Less* is an evidence-based, *online* lifestyle change and weight management program developed by North Carolina State University. The 15-week weight management program works because it's not a diet per se – it's a lifestyle! All weekly classes are conducted online by a live instructor, fostering interaction between the instructor and all participants. The next 15-week session begins on February 5th with the following beginning on March 5th. Individuals can conveniently attend classes from home or office using a computer or mobile device. And best of all, the ADRC has a few vouchers left that would cover the full cost of the program (valued at \$235) for adults age 60 and older for a limited time. I'm excited to be a part of taking our caregiver support group to the next level by hosting an upcoming **Caregiving Conference** here at Peace sometime in April. Stay tuned for more details....

Friendly Reminder: Now that we've kicked off another new year, please make sure you're up-to-date on any and all cancer screening tests, e.g. pap smears, screening colonoscopies, mammograms, etc. The cost of testing is usually covered by all health insurances so don't put it off!
