PARISH NURSE NOTES

The Benefits of Volunteering. Summertime is almost here. That means more time for gardening, family reunions, and time at the cabin for fishing and boating. However, there are still many organizations that rely on the help of volunteers this time of year to continue their important work for the community. If you don't already volunteer in some capacity, did you know that volunteering:

***can help you live longer?** -- A study of aging found that people who volunteer have lower mortality rates than those that don't volunteer.

***decreases the risk of depression?** -- Research has shown that those who volunteer, particularly those over 65 years old, have lower rates of depression, as volunteering lends itself to increased social interaction.

***can reduce stress levels?** -- Volunteering can build individuals' social networks and improve their sense of fulfillment, therefore lessening the effects of stress.

PLC's faith word for June just so happens to be COMMUNITY. In the Dresser/SCF/Osceola area volunteers of many types are needed for everything from driving folks to their appointments for Interfaith Caregivers, to sorting donations at the Adoray Hospice Store, to joining the Friends of Interstate Park. Please consider an opportunity to make our area communities an even better place in which to work and live!

Thanks to PaetyynnBliese and Alivia Maki and the "Why Wait" program at Osceola High School, we now have **Hypoglycemic Kits** at the ready for anyone experiencing a low blood sugar crisis. In the event one of these emergent kits (which have orange labels) is needed to help someone with a critically low blood sugar, know that they are now placed in the following areas of our church:

- ◆ In the AED box that's in the hallway leading to the kitchen
- ◆ Inside the First Aid box in the kitchen
- ◆ Inside the First Aid kit in the church office
- ◆ In the top drawer of the back-of-the-church sound booth

As we try to make sense of the tragedies occurring all around our country and world lately, even the most resilient of people struggle to make sense of the negative headlines. Know that there is help out there for anybody struggling with feeling that they just can't "buck up" or "keep it together" anymore. The Mental Health Task Force of Polk County has been engaging area church leaders in some presentations on Zoom regarding many aspects of mental health in our communities. Please don't hesitate to reach out if you and/or your child need help in dealing with life's difficulties, addictions, fears, or hopelessness. Start by going to the Task Force's website: **mentalhealthpolk.org**. (Keep in mind, this is not a crisis center; for a true mental health emergency call 911.)

Last summer we enjoyed some beautiful Sunday morning services out on the church's front lawn, and we're looking forward to doing that again this summer. Please know if you want to join us but have forgotten a lawn chair, we will have some chairs set up outside for anyone to use. So put on your shorts and sandals, grab a coffee to go, and join us at 9 AM in outdoor worship!

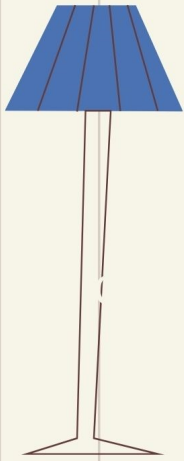

CORNER

“For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come.”

Hebrews 13:14, New International Version

Barnabas writes a fascinating chapter to Jewish believers, connecting the animal sacrifices offered by the Israelites outside the physical limits of the camp as they wandered in the Sinai with the sacrifice of Jesus’ crucifixion outside the gates of Jerusalem. With this verse, he reminds us that our community here on Earth is a temporary one, as we await our eternal home in Heaven.

As we focus on the idea of community during the month of June, and as we kick off the Year of Stewardship with Christmas in July events, it is a good time to consider in which of these two communities—the temporal or the eternal-- we should gather and set aside our time, talents, and treasures. Should we hold tightly to these assets in the here and now, or should we give freely of all that God has given us, amassing eternal wealth in the community created by God’s love?

Jesus answers this question in His Sermon on the Mount, as quoted by Matthew: *“Don’t store up treasures on Earth!.....Instead, store them up in Heaven.....Your heart will always be where your treasure is.”* Matthew 6:19-21, NIV.
