Peace Family & Friends,

I presided over a baptism this past week at Peace and what struck me while celebrating this joyous event was how much COVID has taken away. Over the years I have lost county of how many baptisms I've presided over but I have always looked forward to them. The last few, though, I haven't been able to do the parts of the sacrament that involves touch. I couldn't hold the babies, I couldn't pour the water, I couldn't bless them by making the sign of the cross on their tiny little forehead...I was there to offer the words.

It got me thinking, then, about communion and the loss of contact there, as well. I miss terribly being able to look each of you in the eyes as I place the wafer into your hand. I miss hearing the whispered Amens and Thanks Be to God's. I miss blessing those who are not yet communing.

And beyond that I miss the holy space created by being with people when they are sick, when they are preparing for surgery, and when they are nearing end of life. Those times are places where the Holy Spirit is always so present.

Yet, even as I mourned the loss of these points of contact-the beautiful Spirit showed up and began to point me towards the miracles of Jesus. When his mother Mary tells him to help when they run out of wine-he doesn't go and touch the water-through his word he tells the steward how to bring the miracle about. In Matthew, when the paralytic man's friends bring him to Jesus, it is by his word that he tells him to get up, take his mat and go home. When the 5,000 are fed he does not touch the bread or fish, his disciples do the distributing. In Luke, when the 10 lepers are healed-Jesus simply tells them to go present themselves at the temple.

I am reminded that the Spirit moves and works and does the work of God in many ways, not just through touch. And it wasn't only through Jesus' hands that the miracles came to be-often it was through the hands of his disciples or friends or people in the crowd. When I have the privilege to preside at baptisms right now and I am the bearer of the words but the families and sponsors are the hands that move in the water and the oil, together we are bearing witness to the history of the power of God at work in many and mysterious ways. When we break bread together without our hands meeting we are reminded how the disciples broke bread around the table. And when we are kept separate during times of struggle or heartache we know that the space does not become any less holy but that the Spirit expands to surround us.

In all, it has been a reminder to me that the powers of this world will never overtake our God. No matter what COVID or other illness may try to take away from us God will provide a new way forward.

Reopening Plans

God has brought this community of people together as Peace Lutheran Church and He continues to work in and through us in all that we do. We are excited to begin weekly worship together again, even though it will look different than the past. A task force, composed of doctors, health care professionals, teachers, administrators, and other community members who work closely with COVID, who will be leading us through different phases of reopening. Council unanimously approved Phase 1 of the reopening plan at the last council meeting, which can be found in its entirety in this newsletter. In summary, this means, that we will be worshipping <u>outdoors</u> each week during the month of September (weather permitting) and plan to begin worshipping in the building in October. Through our reopening phases, we will continue to make worship available online through prerecording or live-streaming our services, so if you are not comfortable worshipping in person, you will still be able to worship on our YouTube channel.

This task force has taken into account our county, our members and our community and feels that we can open the building in a safe and responsible way beginning in October. Of course, this could all be subject to change depending on what happens with our schools and in our county in the next couple of weeks. I ask that you support and encourage both the task force and council in this decision, and decisions moving forward, as they have all spent a good amount of time together to collectively decide what is best for Peace Lutheran Church.

We continue to live into this pandemic together, listen to the Holy Spirit, acknowledge that God is at work, and be church together in new ways. The church has never been closed, but I am certainly excited to be present with all of you again soon.

Returning to Worship Proposal

(During Covid-19 Pandemic)

Phase 1:

- * Worship Inside to begin Oct. 4th at the earliest. If, at any point, either OS or SCF schools shut down (or a state/county mandate takes effect), we will follow suit and not hold inside worship.
- * Worship times will be 8:30am and 9:30am, with worship services lasting approx 35-40min. We encourage elderly and immunocompromised to worship at 8:30am and everyone else to worship at 9:30am.
- * Masks Mandatory
- * Operate at 1/4 capacity (60-80 people/service)
- * 1st Service will be held in Sanctuary, 2nd service in Fellowship Hall
- * One way traffic, filling in pews front to back. Encourage people to exit via kitchen door (high risk and elderly may exit front door)
- * Hand sanitize upon entering
- * Disposable/take home children's worship bags
- * maintain 6 feet apart upon entrance
- * Ushers will be needed to guide people
- * No Coffee/Fellowship
- * People will be asked to arrive no more than 15 min. prior to worship
- * Follow state & County guidelines subject to change
- * Bathroom doors open, no drinking fountains
- * Communion will be served 1st & 3rd Sunday of every month (pre-packaged style)
- * Provide High risk area/section at 9:30am worship

September:

outdoor services, weather permitting

October:

8:30 Over 60 and underlying health issues (Sanctuary)

9:30 All others (Fellowship Hall) with a "safe space" for immunocompromised

Phase 2: (TBD)


- * Incorporate Sunday School and Wednesday night programming (plans in progress...)

PARISH NURSE NOTES

<u>PLANNING AHEAD FOR MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT</u> - Each year from October 15th through December 7th (Medicare's Open Enrollment Period) you have the opportunity to review and change your Medicare Part D Plan or Advantage Plan for the upcoming year. For most people, this is the only time of year you may be able to change your plan. Some individuals have found substantial cost savings by comparing and switching plans. If you are happy with your current plan (and make sure to look at the Annual Notice of Change you are required to receive that will outline any proposed changes to the plan you have now) you don't need to do anything. As long as you don't make any changes to your enrollment, your coverage will automatically switch to the new coverage effective January 1st. If you would like to switch to a different plan, you would need to do that between October 15th and December 7th.

Due to COVID19 concerns, there will be no in-person appointments this year at the Aging & Disability Resource Center of Northwest Wisconsin (ADRC). However, you can make appointments for get assistance from them via phone, mail or email. If you currently receive certain Medicare benefits, watch for a reminder letter with an *Open Enrollment Screening Form* that will be going out in <u>September</u> which will indicate how to request the ADRC's help. If you're just looking to compare <u>Medicare Part D</u> plans (prescription drug coverage), **I'd be happy to help you** with that over the phone while I'm online. Just call PLC's office to get that set up.

SPAM & PHISHING: No, I'm not talking about Hormel's canned pork product or trolling for walleyes. Rather it's unwanted junk emails and/or emails that may look legitimate but infect computers with viruses or trick people into providing personal information. There are more of these deceptive and potentially dangerous messages out there than ever. A few red flags that should cause you to pause and act, so you don't fall prey to a scam or loss of your identity are:

- The email uses words like "urgent" or "Click here" or "Important"
- Spelling and grammar are incorrect
- The email is confusing, lacks information or an explanation
- It threatens you with a negative outcome (owing money, losing access, etc.)
- The email doesn't mention your name but is sent/meant just for you
- The sending address doesn't match the name or business in the email

If something looks suspicious, DON'T click on any attachments or links (even "unsubscribe"), DON'T forward to colleagues or friends, and DON'T reply with any information.

Mask Hygiene:

It's great for each of us to have more than one cloth mask in our possession; we now have some at church to give away for those who would like to have a spare or two (to wear while your other ones are being washed.) Cloth masks can be put in with your regular laundry and detergent using warm water, and can be put in the dryer. If you wash your mask by hand, mix 5 tablespoons of bleach with one gallon of water, soak for 5 minutes and air dry.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

"There will always be poor people in the land. Therefore I command you to be openhanded toward your fellow Israelites who are poor and needy in your land." Deuteronomy 15:11.

Jesus quotes the first half of this verse in response to criticism from Judas Iscariot (and perhaps some other Disciples) when Jesus allows Mary (the sister of Lazarus and Martha) to anoint Him with "expensive perfume." Although Judas' motivation was not as pious as the words he spoke, his objection seems logical to us, and Jesus' justification of Mary's gift seems uncharacteristic, given Jesus' compassion for the poor which is so frequently and passionately expressed.

But we seldom hear the full story behind Jesus' quote. God speaks it through Moses as part of God's instructions to see to it that needy people are cared for. Our church, as a congregation of God's people, offers multiple opportunities to carry out this mission. We would do well to obey God's will as expressed in Deuteronomy 15:10a to "Give generously to them and do so without a grudging heart."


