PARISH NURSE NOTES

As is usual this time of year, there's a lot of church activities coming up on the calendar for September and October. I hope one of our educational offerings (such as Sunday School teacher/helper or Confirmation mentor), outreach, or stewardship opportunities speaks to you and causes you to join in to lend a helping hand. After all, these are the core concepts that help make "being a church" a reality! Thanks to all who have stepped up to teach, usher, lay read for worship, help in the kitchen, quilt, visit the homebound – and the list goes on. It's so good to be a part of God's family here at Peace!

Accept Help From Friends and Family Members. If you or someone you know are struggling to manage an acute or chronic debilitating health condition (such as a recent stroke or cancer treatments), learning to let go of some things and to accept help will lower your anxiety levels and likely raise your spirits. People want to help out, but they may not be sure what kinds of assistance you need. Even getting help with the smallest of tasks can lessen your load so you can focus on therapy exercises or just relaxing. Try keeping a list of tasks such as doing laundry or items needed at the store. That way, when friends or family members offer to help, you can give them specific tasks. You can also try using a *caregiver mobile app* to help you coordinate help from family and friends. Examples of caregiving coordination apps include: Lotsa Helping Hands -- www.lotsahelpinghands.com and MyLifeLine -- www.mylifeline.org. Remember that you (or your caregiver) don't have to try to do it all on your own!

Did you know September marks <u>Healthy Aging Month</u>? There is no shortage of articles and TV shows focusing on the t8opic of aging well. In a nutshell, what it comes down to are a few simple concepts:

- Maintaining a healthy weight
- Getting regular exercise/movement
- Eating a healthy diet

There are a number of ways to achieve the above tips (as evidenced by anywhere you look these days!) And if you can master all three, you're not only more likely to survive an adverse health issue, but there's a greater chance you'll live longer with fewer health problems. Now there's a simple concept I need to keep in the forefront of my mind the next time I'm tempted to have a second helping!!!

STEWARDSHIP NOTES

"'What should we do then?' the crowd asked. John answered, 'The man with two tunics should share with him who has none, and the one who has food should do the same." Luke 3:10-11, New International Version.

John's wilderness ministry of baptism and repentance had become popular with first century Jews, whose presence at the Jordan proves that they recognized John as the Messenger whom the prophet Isaiah had foreseen. The crowd seems to have taken seriously John's urging in verse 8 to "Produce fruit in keeping with repentance," as evidenced by their desperate request to know what more they needed to do in order to escape God's judgement.

As Lutherans, we do not believe that obedience to John's orders in verse 11 is required in order for us to receive God's grace. However, we do believe that compliance, as shown by generously sharing our time, talents, and treasures, is evidence of the belief in and acknowledgement of God's love for us. And that love, as "the other John" quotes Jesus' conversation with Nicodemus, means that "...whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal *life.*" John 3:16, NIV.
