- **SB-2232 and HB-2370** allow residents of Tennessee to opt out of having a Smart Meter on their property, and have an analog meter installed instead.
- Smart Meters are associated with biological harm. People have a right to protect their health, without being exposed to microwave radiation 24 hours a day, 7 days a week - that they cannot turn off.
- Some people get very sick when exposed to radiation and dirty electricity from Smart Meters, and cannot live in a home with Smart Meters. Others may not feel effects right away, but after prolonged exposure, experience declining health, such as the diabetes, heart disease, cancer, and neurological diseases from which many suffer from today. Also headaches, insomnia, tinnitus, fertility issues, "brain fog" and memory problems are common symptoms of EMF exposure.
- Privacy is also a concern. Smart Meters record energy usage second by second, in real time, all the time. Without our consent, this is a breach of our privacy rights.
