Asalaam Alaikum Parents and Carers,

It has been an exciting term and staff and children have thoroughly enjoyed teaching and learning! It is been pleasing to see our EYFS children well-settled, and developing their early reading and early mathematics skills. The Key Stage 1 cohort have put in lots of effort towards further developing their phonetical knowledge and improving their comprehension skills. The Year 3s have been working hard at building their problem-solving and reasoning skills across mathematics and science, and the Year 4 have been busy practising their times tables and applying this knowledge in their learning.

The children in the Early Year's enriched their learning by a visit by the local Fire Engine; the Year 1's actively learnt about their local area; the Year 2's had a great away day at Windsor Castle, learning more about the Royals. Year 3 visited the Chiltern Open Air Museum and the local church and Year 4 enjoyed a themed Ancient Egyptian Day. These experiences have been both popular and successful, enabling our children to consolidate and enhance their learning.

As a school, we reflected on our school values: compassion and respect this term by sharing many relevant Quranic verses, reading different stories and carrying out *circle time* and *mindfulness* activities during PSHE lessons. Next term's values are gratitude and service. Kindly spend some time discussing these values with your children during the winter break.

This week, teachers led pastoral meetings with all their class children, to elicit pupil voice and further develop and enrich pupils' learning experiences at school.

#### Religious Education Enrichment



We were blessed with various opportunities to enhance our understanding of different religions, this term. Year 4 focused on the question 'What does it mean to be sorry?' in the Autumn term exploring the concepts of repentance and forgiveness in Islam and Judaism. A visitor from the Jewish community came in and shared how these concepts are practiced in Judaism as well as giving the children the opportunity to ask questions.

Year 3 have been exploring the question, 'What makes some places sacred?'. As part of this they learnt about the features of both mosques and churches and had the opportunity to visit the church to see if they could spot the features in person and learn about the purpose and meaning behind some of these features.







Reception have been learning about the story of Prophet Isa in Islam and Christianity. We were blessed to have a visitor from the Christian community come and share the story of Prophet Isa/Jesus from the Christian perspective as well as lessons about the Islamic beliefs around Lady Maryam and Prophet Isa.

#### Eco-Ambassador Recycling Initiative

Our Ardh Ambassadors (Eco Ambassador) have been looking at how we can look after Allah (SWT) creation and blessings all around us. As part of this, they have started a recycling initiative in our school. Classes received a recycling workshop and are now actively recycling using the new recycling bin system in each class. #### Baking bread

den building, archery, and creating a fire!










#### Forces in Action!
