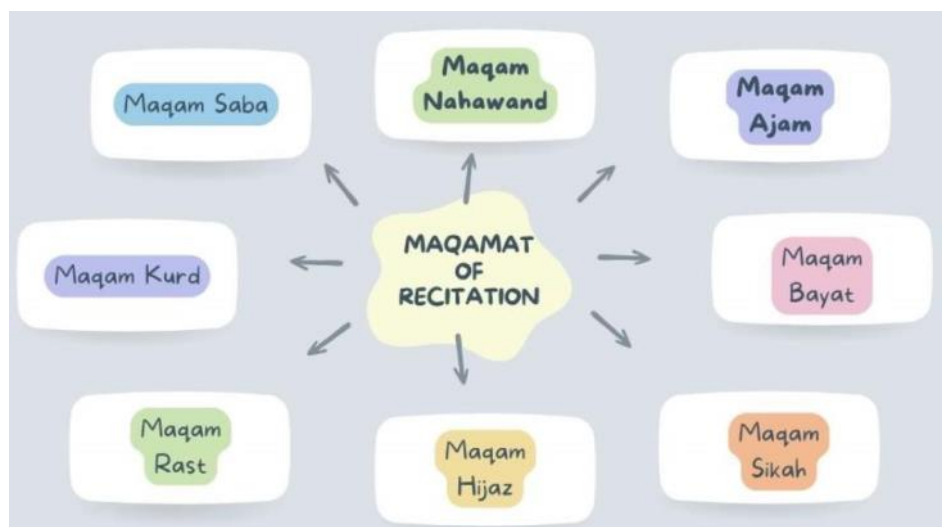

This month we have been applying our vocals training from our bespoke nasheeds/music curriculum to reciting the Quran in different tunes to create different moods and reflect the meaning of the verses. The children enjoyed practicing Maqam Ajum and Maqam Saba and were keen to continue learning some of the other tunes and techniques for reciting Quran beautifully.



As our children grow it is important that we provide them with opportunities and an understanding of how to grow their relationship with our Lord. This term, we were blessed to have both a female and male scholar hold a workshop with our Year 3 students titled 'Finding your Path', whilst simultaneously holding a parent workshop in supporting our children and journeying towards Allah (SWT) as a family. Learning lots in Year 3

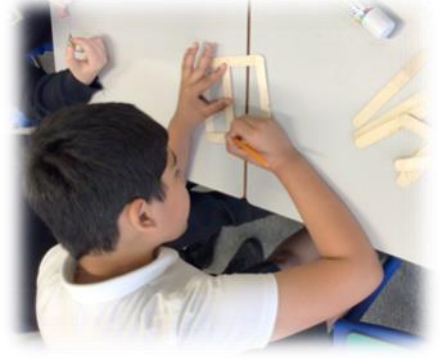
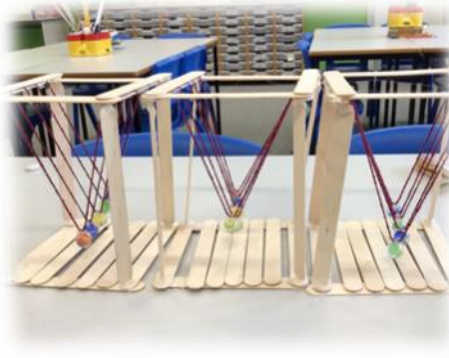
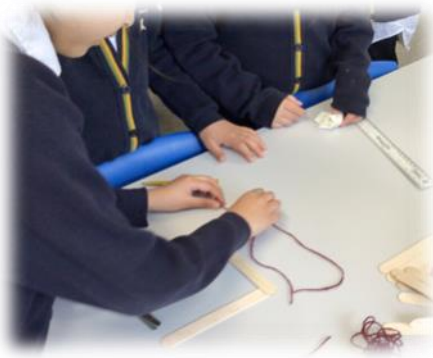
Children enjoyed Forest School sessions in school. These sessions were a great opportunity for team building, problem solving and caring for the environment.
