### Message from the Headteacher

Asalaam Alaikum parents and carers,

We are suddenly approaching the end of the school term and our teachers are preparing for a very busy period of tests (from Year 2 to Year 4) and teacher assessments. They will make judgements regarding each child's current level of attainment and these will be reviewed by myself and Mrs. Saad over a period of two and half days to ensure that these are accurate. Academic targets will then be set for the children, Insha'Allah. We had an excellent turnout for parent's evening over the past two weeks and it was a pleasure to be a part of some of the conversations that took place. As teachers, it is wonderful that the work that is done at school is enhanced by fantastic parental support at home. Such partnerships can only end in success for the children!

Once again, I would like to thank our volunteers who have helped us in the classroom, the library and on the playground, where we are trying to improve the children's quality of play. We have, this week, purchased some new playground equipment to encourage more productive play (much of which will be brought out of classrooms at playtimes) and we expect that this will help reduce the number of bumps and bruises that occur when children spend most of their time running, especially in the Key stage 1 playground.

I am delighted that Mrs. Jessa has been able to arrange trips that will enhance the children's knowledge and understanding of the other Abrahamic faiths this week, with a workshop on Judaism and a trip to All Saints Church for children in Year 3.

Many parents, who take the trouble to park in areas away from the school have asked me about the continued parking near the bus stop and the blocking of resident's driveways, sometimes coming far too close to families who are using the path. I do intend to try to persuade those that continue to do this to desist but if this fails, the steps taken will be much stronger in Spring term. I really do hope that I am not required to take firmer measures to protect the reputation of our school and faith community.
