Message from the Headteacher

As salaamu alaikum wa rahmatullahi wa barakatahu,

All praise and thanks to Allah (SWT) for allowing us to live through another year. We are now entering the month of Muharram, just as the academic year is drawing to a close. Summer term is always the busiest term in primary schools. Children and staff have been working extremely hard this year and although there is a lot of hard work ahead of us, I am confident that we have what it takes to bring about positive change at the school.

Parents of children in Key stage 2 will see that we have received a large delivery of low barriers. These will be used in the Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 playgrounds to provide discrete areas for football and basketball which I hope cuts down on the number of collision accidents that do sometimes occur. Next term, we are looking at developing our sporting capacity within the school. We have recently been in contact with Harrow Borough to enter ourselves into more interschool competitions and, as mentioned in a previous newsletter, we will be offering martial arts training for our children shortly insha'Allah. You are very welcome to attend our sports day on the 18th July. The Key Stage 2 events will be held at Bentley Wood School playing fields and the EYFS/Key Stage 1 events on school premises. They are scheduled at different times of the day so that parents can attend both. Please refer to the email for full details.

Year 3 will visit Headstone Manor on the 4th July and Year 1 will go to Bekonscott Model Village on the 15th July. Our Reception classes had a lovely day at Willows Farm on the 26th June. Thank you to staff and all parents who help out on our trips. Your support is really invaluable and it contributes to our children's experience. I would like to thank Ms Laamri who is holding a Charlie and the Chocolate Factory Day for children in Year 2 and this will include a hands on workshop led by the chocolate Museum. She has been very busy with book week and it has been very pleasing to see so many children showing in such a lot of interest in the wide range of books on offer. On top of this she arranged a highly successful Read and Relax Day on Wednesday. Many children told me how much they enjoyed this event in particular.

I would like to thank Mrs. Mahir and Mrs. Haider, together with Mrs. Aksouh and all of the children for the wonderful assemblies we have seen over the past two weeks in An Noor and Al Hakeem classes. We heard some lovely recitation, singing and some fantastic acting from the children. I will run a drama club next term insha'Allah for children in Years 4 and 5 to give the children a broader public performance experience insha'Allah.

Some of our parents have been absolute stalwarts during our gardening days, putting up greenhouses, painting fences, constructing and painting picnic tables and a host of other jobs for the sake of Allah (SWT). They have made a real difference to the Key Stage 1 area, working long hours in the heat to bring this about. We still have a large number of fence panels that need to be painted. Each panel can be painted within two hours or so and I would like to ask parents to "paint a panel". If you complete a panel with or without your child(ren)'s, you can add your child(ren)s name(s) to the panel itself. I am really hoping that we can complete this project by the end of term. The next gardening day will be on Saturday 12th July and the school gates will be open at 10:00am.

Hujjat walking club enjoyed a lovely stroll around the Ruislip Lido last Sunday and our next walk will start from Denham Country Park at 10:00am on 13th July. We will walk along the banks of the Rivel Colne which supports an abundance of wildlife including many species of fish and aquatic birds including herons and kingfishers which we hope to spot as we follow the trail.
