Message from the Headteacher

Asalaam Alaikum parents and carers,

There has been a strong focus on emotional well-being this year and I am very pleased to be able to announce a number of strategies that will become available for children at Hujjat over the coming weeks. A number of our staff members have been trained to deliver Lego Therapy and others have completed training in emotional literacy. Another member of staff is about to embark on bereavement support for children and although we do hope not to have to utilise this very often, we do appreciate that many children have grandparents and other relatives abroad and that they may not have the support around them at times of difficulty. I am currently training, along with seventeen other senior leaders in Harrow to become leaders of emotionally healthy schools. The focus is on a whole-school approach to support age-appropriate social and emotional development for every child. One of our staff members will qualify as a licenced Thrive practitioner when she completes her training.

I am delighted that Mrs. Jessa has been able to arrange visitors to school that have enhanced the children's knowledge and understanding of the other faiths this week as part of our SACRE RE curriculum.

I am also pleased to be able to advise parents of children in Al Wahhaab that we have recruited a strong candidate for Mrs. Laamri's class when she takes maternity leave in January.

I would like to thank our parent volunteers who have been working very hard to improve road safety around the school. These volunteers have worked tirelessly and very successfully to keep our children safe and to reduce complaints from neighbours.

We are now approaching the end of the school term and our teachers are preparing for a very busy period of tests (from Year 2 to Year 5) and teacher assessments. They will make judgements regarding each child's current level of attainment and these will be reviewed by myself and Mrs. Saad over a period of two and half days to ensure that they are accurate. Academic targets will then be set for the children, Insha'Allah. We had an excellent turnout for parent's evening over the past two weeks and it was a pleasure to be a part of some of the conversations that took place. As teachers, it is wonderful that the work that is done at school is enhanced by fantastic parental support at home. Such partnerships can only end in success for the children!

We have been doing our best to provide an enriching curriculum and I would ask all parents to view our Enrichment and Personal Development Handbook which can be found on the website.

Unfortunately, there will no walking club this weekend but we are hoping to re-instate this soon Insha'Allah.


