Message from the Headteacher

As salaamu alaikum wa Rahmatullahi wa barakhatahu,

We have enjoyed some beautiful weather this week, alhamdulillah and this made the scooter training and Hujjat Fun Run, especially enjoyable. It was very pleasing to see so many children learning how to ride safely. Please ensure that your child has a water bottle, hat and sunscreen over the remainder of summer to protect them from the dangers of strong sunshine and high temperatures.

This week, children in Year 2 did their tests a little earlier than the rest of school. We administer the optional Key Stage 1 tests which must be done in during the May window. Years 1, 3 4 and 5 will take their during the week commencing 15th June. I would not recommend and special preparation for these tests at home. Children need to face the tests as they would any task at school to avoid the sense that they are under pressure. The test results do not form the basis of the teacher assessments. They are only a snapshot of the overall level of attainment and are used to justify and confirm the teachers view of the child's level of attainment.

Children in Year 1 will be taking the statutory phonics screening check during the week of the 8th June and Children in Year 4 will have their statutory multiplication tables test during the first week back after half term.

School attendance has been up and down over the past few weeks. The Department for Education provides every funded school with a target for attendance and to meet it, parents will need to ensure that children are in school right up until the final day of the school year (registration is taken both in the morning and afternoon). If we have sufficient numbers of children during the last week, I am hopeful that the target can be met, Insha'Allah.

It has been a very busy first half of term and I would like to thank all members of staff who provided support for parents with curriculum information events. Maths day was once again a great success and very popular with the children. Thank you for all the innovative dressing up ideas on the day. We have had visits to Tower of London, Legoland, the Natural History Museum and the British Museum over the past weeks, and we have had lovely feedback from the children. With summer term comes the opportunity for more outdoor events and I am delighted that children in Key Stage 1 were able to take part in the Key Stage 1 Multiskills event at St. Bernadette's Primary School and children in Key Stage 2 attended the Quod Kids Athletics Festival. I would like to thank Ms. Hassan, Mrs. Shinwari and our sports coach, Mr. Jordan for organising these sporting events this side of half term. Year 4 enjoyed a healthy eating workshop at the end of April. In Reception this week, children were able to experience the joy of watching chicks hatch and witness the wonder of how Allah creates. I would like to thank all of the parents who attended the Head Teacher's Forum last week. The topics I have covered during the last two forum events have included; Anxiety in Primary Aged Children, its Causes and Solutions, Raising Standards for Girls at Hujjat, The Use of AI to Support Adaptive Teaching and the Thrive Approach to Wellbeing at Hujjat. I try to tailor these mornings to what I perceive to be the needs of our families and the feedback has been amazingly supportive. Some of the attendees have suggested that I repeat them online and send the slides out to parents. I am happy to do this and will provide you with dates and times Insha'Allah.

FOHPS are holding their Summer Fair on Sunday 7th June from 2:00pm. It promises to be a lovely event for the whole community and we do hope that many of you are able to attend. Please remember that tickets need to be purchased in advance. FOHPS do an amazing job in organising their events but they still need volunteers to help both during events and after them so that school is ready for the children again on the next school day. Children need to be supervised at all times both in the hall and in the school playgrounds. They should not be left unsupervised on school equipment at any time as school staff will not be there to look after them.

Please remember that Hujjat Walking Club will meet at the Chapel Lane entrance (HA5 1AA) at 10:30am on Sunday 24th May.

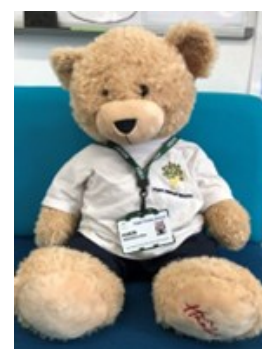
'Pupils of the Week' Achievements
