Hours: 11:15am – 1:15pm term time only as required

PURPOSE OF THE JOB:

To provide on call support to the midday supervisory team

To ensure the safety, welfare and good conduct, either individually or as part of a team, of children at lunchtimes, during the midday break period. To provide a positive role model to the children at all times. To maintain confidentiality at all times. To ensure children eat healthily at lunchtimes

The post holder will work under the supervision and direction of the SLT on duty

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES AND TASKS:

To ensure that where more than one sitting is required involving children coming in from playgrounds or classrooms and others going out to playgrounds or into classrooms, there is no period when the playground is left unsupervised.

To supervise children during the lunch period ensuring children are supervised at all times and that all children behave appropriately and are kept safe. This includes the classrooms, corridors and the dining hall.

Be vigilant for Health and Safety and security issues and refer to the Site Manager or Headteacher.

To assist in putting out cutlery and trays in the dining hall.

To support children with good eating etiquette.

To support children in clearing away their trays, plates and cutlery.

To assist in cleaning the tables, clearing trolley and floor during and at the end of lunch service.

To monitor children when eating, encouraging them to eat healthily and to report any concerns to SLT or Class teacher.

To foster the principle of family dining.

To play with and support the children in the playground.

To assist the children in setting up games or activities, abiding by the rules constructively.

All Staff will:

- Support the aims and policies of the school.
- Keep up to date with current trends in education.
- Aim to foster good relations between the school and the community.

This job description will be reviewed as part of the Performance Management Process but may be changed at any time if necessary.
