In R.E. the children have been exploring a wide range of topics. EYFS have been looking at charity and water in various faiths. Year 1 have been thinking about the key question 'Is it important to have a day that is different to others?' linking with special days in religions such as Jumu'ah in Islam and Shabbat in Judaism and have also reflected on religious sounds such as the Adhan and Quran in Islam and bells, prayers and chants in Buddhism. Year 2 have been learning about rules in various religions and religious symbols and reflecting on their importance and Year 3 have been reflecting on 'happiness' in Islam and other religions as well as the importance of prayer.



Well done to all children who had amazing costumes on World Book Day, showcasing characters from stories around the world.










Year 2: The Great Fire of London Workshop
