Year 2

Forest School Experience

On Thursday 6th July, Year 2 celebrated the end of the year with a fantastic Forest School Experience.

The children learnt that nature is an endowed beauty and mercy for all people. In Islam it is encouraged to reflect on the signs of nature in order to understand the world, ourselves and God. The Quran tells us that human beings are placed on earth as God's representatives or 'Khalifah'. Children were taught that they are trusted to take care of and enjoy the wonders of earth and Forest School provides the perfect opportunity for

this. Forest School is an inspirational, holistic process, that offers children opportunities to achieve, develop confidence and self-esteem, through hands on learning experiences in a local woodland environment.

We began by reading a favourite: 'Allah made everything' by Zain Bhikha as the children enjoyed their summer fruit snacks made in their food technology workshop. children then took part in different activities around the school. They had the opportunity to make nature crafts, including crowns and bracelets decorated with summer flowers and leaves; they made mud recipes and paintings in the mud kitchen and were able to use their investigative skills to find flora and fauna on a scavenger hunt. Not to forget, the children enjoyed nature-inspired face painting!

We hope this was a memorable experience for the children and look forward to many more!









Whole School Hajj Simulation

Our children have had a wonderful opportunity to mark the Islamic calendar event of Hajj by participating in a 'Mini Hajj Experience' at school this year. As well as performing a replica of the actions of Hajj, we focused on the intentions and reflections behind each action performed.

The children began their 'Mini Hajj Experience' by making an intention and entering the state of Ihram. They created a compass and looked at how making the wrong intention can lead you in the wrong direction but if we make the right intention, we will be led on the right path towards Allah (SWT). The children then travelled to our Mecca replica as a class, reciting the talbiyya and actions to help them understand the meaning of what was being said. They then performed the Tawaf, circling the Ka'ba replica 7 times, whilst reflecting on how they will make Allah the center of everything they do for 7 days of the week.

Next, the children performed a mini-Saee, walking between Safa and Marwa mountains 7 times while reflecting on the story of Sayyida Hajra and her son, Prophet Ismail.

From there, they went to the Mount of Arafat, where they thought carefully about what they would ask forgiveness for and any habits they would like to change. Through an experiment, we enabled the children to reflect on how Muslims ask for forgiveness at Hajj and return clean and sinless.

At Muzdalifa, the children made their pebbles by writing what they were sorry for on a piece of paper and scrunching it up to form a pebble. They then took these to Mina, where they threw them at the 3 pillars of Jamaraat, while asking Allah to help them keep away from these mistakes and reflecting on the story and qualities of Prophet Ibrahim.

Continuing to reflect on the story of Prophet Ibrahim and his devotion and obedience to Allah (SWT), the children learnt about the sacrifice performed at Hajj. To replicate this act of being willing to sacrifice something we love for the pleasure of Allah, just as Prophet Ibrahim did, the children donated an item of food to those in need. These donations were taken to the Sufra foodbank, who were very grateful for such a generous donation. Thank you to all of you for your contributions, Jazak'Allah, may Allah reward you.

Our Hajj experience ended with an Eid celebration, making Eid cards to gift to our families. We reflected on and celebrated our fresh start and the changes we had promised to make, to take us closer to Allah, in our 'Mini Hajj Experience'.

Alhamdulillah, the children enjoyed and learnt a lot from the experience and there was a real buzz in the school as the children would share their experiences with each other and staff. May Allah grant our children all the opportunity to be able to take forward this learning in their daily lives and one day perform the real Hajj in Mecca Insha'Allah.









Mini Marathon

We were delighted to have our first TCS Mini London Marathon in schools at Hujjat Primary School on 11 May 2023. What made this event special was that the organisers had set a special challenge this year to achieve a Guinness World Records title by recording the most pledges for an exercise campaign in one month.

The children had great fun running, jogging and walking one mile around the school. This event is part of our commitment to inspire exercise and healthy activity in our children, regardless of age or ability. Getting our children active from a young age has many benefits and we are looking to create more opportunities to encourage this in school.

We are happy to share that we raised over £4,500 from this campaign, thanks to your generous contributions. The funds will be used for a second phase of an Islamic design project for the school corridors and main hall, which the children will be able to enjoy from the next school term.
