This week we focused on *internet safety* during our PSHE lessons, followed by an assembly on Friday. We discussed the importance of being kind, in person, as well as online, and also how we must be safe online by following adult instructions and with supervision.

Also, this week, our Year 2 children were honoured to welcome Sheikh Alihusain Datoo to talk to them about rules in Islam from the Quran and the life of the Prophet (peace be upon him).
