Message from the Faith Advisor

Asalaam Alaikum

This week, in our assembly, we reflected on verse 70 from Surah Ahzaab, Chapter 33, which says:

يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا اتَّقُوا اللَّهَ وَقُولُوا قَوْلًا سَدِيدًا

Yā ayyuhalladhīna āmanūt-taḥqullāh wa-qulū qawlan sadīda

O you who believe! Be God conscious and speak the right words (33:70)

Commentaries, explain that a 'right word (سَدِيدًا)' is strong and firm like a dam. It is true, consistent and withstands the waves of falsehood, not allowing them to seep through and weaken it.

Our words are a reflection of our heart, mind and soul. They allow us to communicate and are powerful tools. With this tool we can begin to build our integrity externally and internally. As we reflect on this verse, we remember the words of the Holy Prophet (Peace and blessings be upon him) who said, "The faith of a servant (of Allah) does not truly straighten unless his heart straightens, and his heart does not straighten unless his tongue straightens." (Bihar-ul-'Anwar, Vol. 17, P. 78)

It is a reminder to us to be God conscious in what we say, making our word firm, right and true, regardless of the consequences. For it is when our words are only for the sake of Allah that they are most powerful and effective.

May Allah, guide us all to build our integrity as a family, by applying the teachings of this inspiring verse from the Holy Quran.
