This week we reflected on the first part of verse 13 from Surah Hujarat, Chapter 49, which says:

يَا أَيُّهَا النَّاسُ إِنَّا خَلَقْنَاكُمْ مِنْ ذَكَرٍ وَأُنْثَىٰ وَجَعَلْنَاكُمْ شُعُوبًا وَقَبَائِلَ لِتَعَارَفُوا

"Oh mankind! Indeed, we have created you from a male and a female and made you into peoples and tribes so that you may get to know one another..."

This week (1st May 2023 – 7th May 2023) is deaf awareness week and Allah teaches us here to get to know one another, regardless of our differences.
