Message from the Headteacher

Asalaam Alaikum parents and carers,

This is the last of my bi-weekly emails this term. A termly newsletter will be sent out next week.

I am delighted to be able to advise that the school has gained the Bronze Healthy Schools award and I would like to thank Mrs. Saad for all her hard work around this project. She has already started work on obtaining the Transport for London Stars award, coupled with Active Schools status as our ardh ambassadors begin their cleaner air project at the beginning of the new year. I had the pleasure of meeting with a teacher from Harrow Boys School this week and I am hoping to let you know about some exciting opportunities for our children over the coming years in partnership with the boarding school.

I was extremely impressed by the children who took part in the Language Nut Arabic competition. At least 10,000 children worldwide took part in this and we had several children who made their way into the top 30–50 applicants which is an amazing achievement and one of which they should be very proud of. Well done to all! Congratulations to all the children who took part in the Bebras challenge which enabled them to test out their computational thinking skills. Many of our children participated, achieved merits and distinctions showing impressive skills in this area of their learning. Thank you to Mrs. Rizvi & Mrs. Sookun for arranging this. Next week our choir will visit a local old people's home to sing nasheeds. Many thanks to Mrs. Jessa for this lovely outreach project.

Well done to all of our boys and girls who were awarded their first Taekwondo level last week.

I would like to say a word of thanks to all of the various groups of parents who are selflessly giving up their time to help improve the school experience for all. The FOHPS quiz night was an amazing success and was very well attended. The event was very well organised and ran like clockwork from beginning to end, including the cleaning and tidying at the end. Well done for all your efforts to bring the school community together this term.

I would also like to thank the parent working groups who have been working hard to provide better parking provision by pursuing negotiations with Harrow College. It is likely to take some time before we have a solution to this ongoing challenge but their efforts have been outstanding. I would also like to thank the parents that are giving up their time to help children get into school safely. All of the complaints from neighbours have dried up completely and we have even received thanks and messages of support. There are still a few issues regarding the need for care whilst parking on Brookshill. The school is not recommending that Brookshill should be used for parking as it is still unlawful to do so. At the very least, those doing this please be aware of pedestrians with buggies when opening car doors and avoid blocking the pathway altogether. Thanks to the parents that have provided substantial help in putting together the donations page on the website and for making lots of other arrangements behind the scenes. Finally, I would like to thank the wonderful parent volunteers that have been working with our children in the classrooms, in the library and other parts of the school. It has been amazing to watch the community come together over the course of this year and last and I am extremely grateful for your ongoing support. Please remember that school finishes at 1pm for EYFS/KS1 & 1.10pm for KS2 on Friday 19th December for the Winter break.


Message from the Faith Advisor


'Pupils of the Week' Achievements
