From Little Acorns and Seeds

Riley Roberson probably knows more about the fascinating history displayed among the granite, marble and metal of Washington's oldest cemetery than anyone around. He also knows a little something about the grand old trees in that cemetery – the ones on the

south side of St. Peter's Episcopal Church.

A stroll along Main Street by St. Peter's offers up a nice view of the cemetery and its trees. But walk AMONG the graves and you'll gain much more appreciation for the history of those buried there and the trees that tower over them. Just ask Riley, who is a member of ReLeaf Washington.

Magnolias, live oaks, dogwoods, crepe myrtles, a Norway spruce, Japanese cherry, and a male ginkgo grace the grounds. (Never plant a female ginkgo; the fruit stinks to high Heaven!)

According to the eminent Washington historian Edmund Harding, the oldest of these trees was planted in 1875, making them 145 years old. Many of the town's founding family members were laid to rest long before that.

After enduring such unflattering monikers as Forks of the Tar, Bonner Town, and Pea Town, "Washington" finally got a name that stuck in 1776. The town was laid out in half-acre lots. Lot #50 was designated for a church. St. Peter's was the result.

Go and take a look. It's one of those places that has sensory appeal regardless of whether you look up or down. It's all good. Really good.
