Here Comes the Judge, Here Comes the Judge!

Who remembers Sammy Davis Jr. dressed up in a gaudy judge's robe and a white barrister-style wig on *Rowan & Martin's Laugh-In*? This November 3rd we can elect 15 justices/judges from the Texas Supreme Court to local Justice of the Peace.



The Supreme Court is composed of the Chief Justice and eight justices. The justices are elected to staggered six-year terms so that the court cannot be completely changed in one election. This is the court of last resort for civil matters in Texas. We will be voting for **Supreme Court: Chief Justice, Jimmy Blacklock; Justice Place 2, James P. Sullivan; Justice Place 7, Kyle Hawkins; and Justice Place 8, Brett Busby.**

Texas Court of Criminal Appeals is the highest court for criminal cases. The Court is composed of a Presiding Judge and eight Judges who are elected to staggered six-year terms. We will be voting for **Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals: Place 3, Thomas Smith; Place 4, Kevin Patrick Yeary; and Place 9, John Messinger.**

The Fifteenth Court of Appeals is a statewide intermediate appellate court. The Court is composed of three justices. We will be voting for **15th Court of Appeals: Chief Justice, Scott Brister; Justice Place 2, Scott K. Field; and Justice Place 3, April Farris.**

The Fourth Court of Appeals has intermediate jurisdiction of both civil and criminal cases appealed from lower courts in thirty-two counties of Texas. The Fourth Court of Appeals is comprised of the Chief Justice and six judges. We will be voting

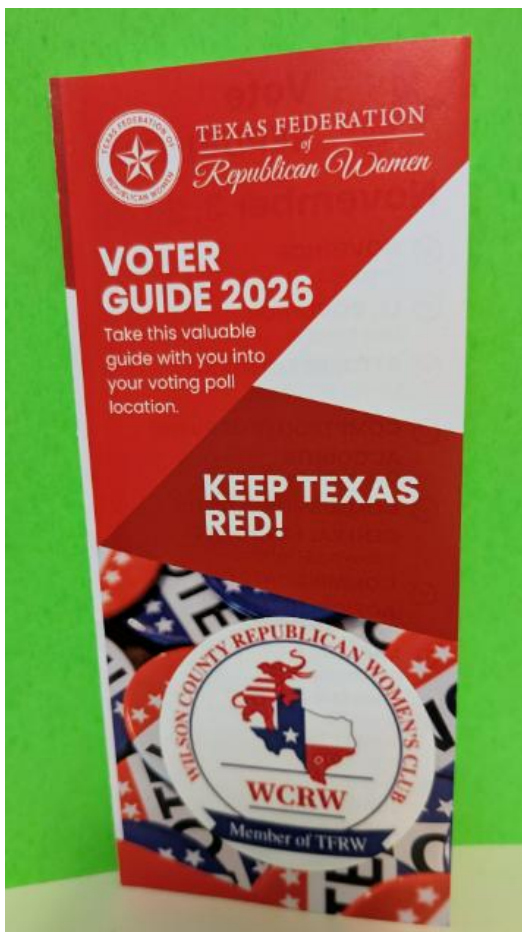
for **Chief Justice, 4th Court of Appeals, Bert Richardson.**

The 81st Judicial District Court and 218th Judicial District Court both serve five counties, one of which is Wilson County. We will be voting for the **81st Judicial District Judge, Jennifer Ebrom Dillingham** and the **218th Judicial District Judge, Russell Wilson.**

Support these 13 judges by voting for every one of them. Every statewide judge has an opponent, so every vote is crucial. Also vote for our **Wilson County Judge, Mike Monreal**, and your local **Justice of the Peace: Precinct 1, Jared Shaw; Precinct 2, Kenneth Buck Griffin; Precinct 3, Joel Bellinger; and Precinct 4, Monica Lambeck Gutierrez.** Judges preserve our freedoms by upholding the rule of law and supporting the Constitution. God bless our Judges; they have loads of patience listening to people. Here Comes the Judge!

Purple Heart Day was on August 7 and commemorates the creation of the oldest American military decoration for military merit. The Purple Heart honors men and women who are of the Military Order of the Purple Heart. During the American Revolutionary War, the Badge for Military Merit decorated six known soldiers.

General George Washington created the Badge of Merit in 1782. Its design included a purple, heart-shaped piece of silk bound with a thin edge of silver. Across the face, the word Merit was embroidered in silver. While the badge symbolized the courage and devotion of an American Patriot, no one knows who designed the award. Until Washington's 200th birthday, the Purple Heart persisted as a Revolutionary War footnote. Through the efforts of General Douglas MacArthur, the U.S. War Department created the Order of the Purple Heart. Today the medal bears a bust of George Washington and his coat of arms.

While an accurate and complete list of names no longer exists, National Geographic recently estimated that nearly 1.9 million service members have earned Purple Hearts since its creation. It is the oldest U.S. military honor bestowed upon service members today. Until 1944, the Purple Heart recognized service members' commendable actions as well. Then in 1944, the requirements limited the award to only those wounded or killed in combat.

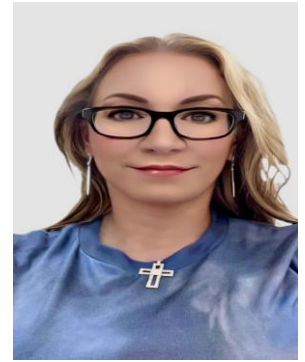

Legislature

In a court document filed August 10, 2026, new Texas Secretary of State Robert Howden stated his opposition to a proposal by the Republican Party of Texas and the Texas Attorney General's Office to impose a Consent Judgment that would implement a closed Primary election. Amarillo Republican activist, Chip Hunt, filed a lawsuit seeking to have portions of the Texas Election Code that [require open primaries to be held unconstitutional](#). In October, the Party – joined by the Texas Attorney General's office – filed a [Joint Motion for Entry of Consent Judgment](#) that asked United States District Judge Matthew J. Kacsmaryk to “enter a final judgment declaring that: (1) the current open primary system is in violation of Plaintiffs’ First Amendment rights; (2) that the Republican Party of Texas is entitled to identify those who associate with the Party and to exclude those who do not associate with the Party from participating in a primary election selecting the Party’s nominees for the general election ballot; and (3) that Texas Election Code sections 162.002, .003, 172.001, and .002 are unconstitutional to the extent that they interfere with the rights of the Republican Party of Texas and Chip Hunt.” Howden stated, “the Secretary believes that this issue can and will be resolved by the Legislature in the coming months.” He also stated, “The Secretary continues to believe that the Legislature is the proper forum for adopting any closed primary system and thoughtfully crafting the detailed scheme that would govern it. Governor Greg Abbott, Lt. Governor Dan Patrick, and House Speaker Dustin Burrows have all indicated support for closed primary elections in recent months. At the Republican Party of Texas State Convention in June, [Governor Abbott told attendees](#), “We are going to make clear that, in the future, only Republicans vote in Republican Primaries.”

WCRW 2026 MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Mark your calendars! The Wilson County Republican Women's club is excited to be hosting a Membership Drive on **November 14, 2026**, at the Dewees-Remschel House.

As of August 21, WCRW has 75 Primary Members and 30 Associate Members. Because 2026 is an election year, we set a goal of reaching 100 Primary Members. A secondary goal was to at least match our 2025 total of 83 Primary Members. At this point, we are short of both goals. So ever being an optimist, I reviewed membership numbers over a 5-year period to see if our statistics were truly downward trending. Results: 2022 – 65; 2023 – 74; 2024 – 82; 2025 – 83; 2026 – 75. Even with this lower number, it is not a downward trend, just a blip! (As a side note, I recently chatted with other clubs and found most were also experiencing lower numbers this year. Several voiced the opinion they thought it was because Trump wasn't on the ballot.) Even so, the issues facing our community and country remain important, and WCRW's work continues to matter.

WCRW is already beginning to plan for 2027, starting with a Membership Drive on **November 14, 2026**. We are delighted to hold the event at the Dewees-Remschel House, and it promises to be an enjoyable gathering. More information will be shared soon.

Representative Ryan Guillen of Texas House District 31 was the guest speaker at the Wilson County Republican Women's Club meeting on August 25 at Witte's BBQ in La Vernia. A Texas A&M agriculture graduate, sixth-generation South Texas rancher, and small businessman, Rep. Guillen was elected at age 24, making him one of the youngest legislators in Texas history. He chairs the House Committee on Agriculture & Livestock and serves on the Committee on Congressional Redistricting, Select Committee on Redistricting, and Committee on State Affairs. Rep. Guillen discussed his advocacy for job creation, tax cuts, border security, education reform, and rural interests. He noted that recent legislation raised the homestead exemption to \$140,000 and to \$200,000 for seniors and



disabled homeowners, providing school district property tax relief. Data center development was also a major topic. Rep. Guillen said the Texas Legislature will meet in 2027 and plans to consider legislation requiring data centers to recycle water and generate their own electricity. He also supports moving to five-year property appraisals and capping appraisal increases at 3%, down from the current 10%. Rep. Guillen also holds Dairy Queen tours on the second Saturday of March, July, and November, visiting a DQ in each county he represents to hear constituents' needs and concerns. Club members and guests enjoyed his detailed presentation of the many diverse things our State Senators and Representatives address in each legislative session.



We have a little over two months before early voting begins, which starts on Monday, October 19th running through Friday, October 30th. In this issue you will find the two political activities calendars along with the voting information, hope you find it helpful. Since WCRW is a Texas PAC, I cannot include the federal candidates. We submitted another stellar performance for our second quarter political activities report; 1,304 calls and 7,270 hours. Everyone deserves a big YEEHAW!! 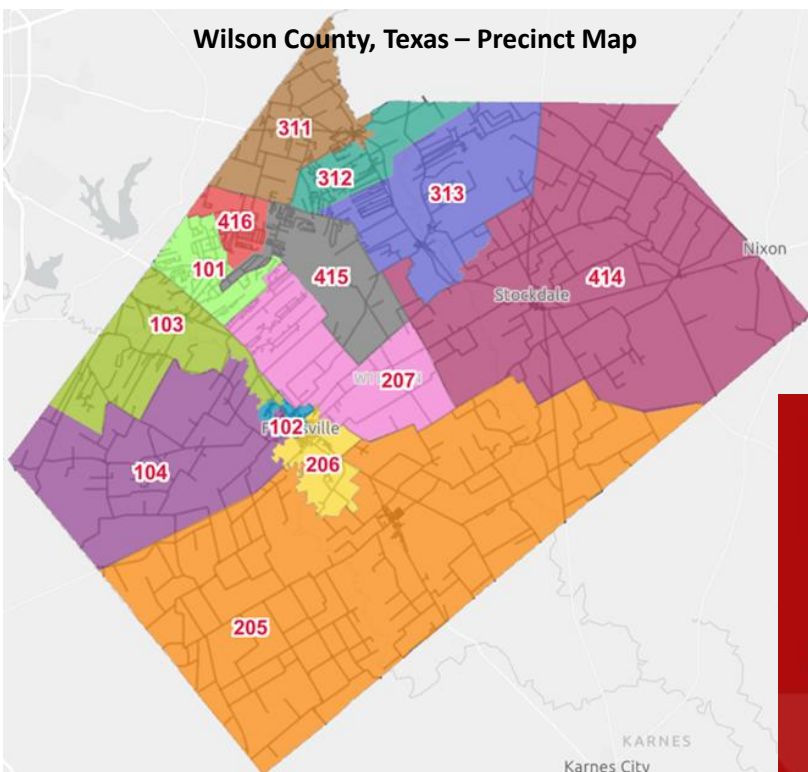
