

HOPE CIRCLE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

Hope Circle will meet on Thursday, Jan. 12th at 11:00 in the Social Room to discuss *West with Giraffes* by Lynda Rutledge. Woodrow Wilson Nickel, age 105, feels his life ebbing away. But when he learns giraffes are going extinct, he finds himself recalling the unforgettable experience he cannot take to his grave.



It's 1938. The Great Depression lingers. Hitler is threatening Europe, and world-weary Americans long for wonder. They find it in two giraffes who miraculously survive a hurricane while crossing the Atlantic. What follows is a twelve-day road trip in a custom truck to deliver Southern California's first giraffes to the San Diego Zoo. Behind the wheel is the young Dust Bowl rowdy Woodrow. Inspired by true events, the tale weaves real-life figures with fictional ones, including the world's first female zoo director, a crusty old man with a past, a young female photographer with a secret, and assorted reprobates as spotty as the giraffes.

Part adventure, part historical saga, and part coming-of-age love story, *West with Graffes* explores what it means to be changed by the grace of animals, the kindness of strangers, the passing of time, and a story told before it's too late. (From the publisher.)

A recent survey revealed that we have 1048 items in our library, including CDs and DVDs. We've got Biblical commentaries, devotional materials, craft idea books, cookbooks, biographies, tales of spiritual journeys, romance novels and novels of suspense and adventure! Sadly, the survey also revealed that only 15% of the library's offerings have ever been checked out.

The book checked out most often (8 times) is <u>John Wesley: His Life and Theology</u> by Robert Tuttle. We have 1 book checked out 5 times; 5 books checked out 4 times; 7 books checked out 3 times; 29 books checked out twice; and 104 books checked out once.

We are in the process of locating shelves to better display the children's book collection so children can see the colorful covers and reach the books.

The collection will be reduced through careful culling to make room for books with fresher content.

As always, if you have a book suggestion, please put it in the church library mail slot. The church library is downstairs, in the same room as the Social Hall. So, come on down and check it out!
