Beloved Church Family,

I pray that you are growing in faith as you faithfully utilize the means of grace, praying without ceasing, spending time in the word of God, engaging in worship and fellowship and participating in mission.

The Christian community is strengthened and sustained through prayer. Every dimension of Christian life is undergirded by prayer. Jesus himself prayed for all people—including those who had not yet come to believe (John 17:20–23) and his followers continue to embrace that example. Prayer is how we communicate with God and how we stand together in solidarity as the Church.

There are various forms of prayer we offer to God: **Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication (ACTS)**. Just as we speak with others about matters of law, politics, health, daily habits, and personal interests, we may bring all aspects of life before God in prayer. There are no limits to what we can share with God. For example, about two years ago, a family from our son’s former school relocated to England. In one of their updates, they asked the community to pray that they would make new friends. Their request reflects a simple but profound truth: people are unafraid to bring their needs before God and are willing to invite others to stand with them in prayer.

When we approach God in prayer, we do more than ask for help. We honor God’s worth, acknowledge our shortcomings, give thanks for blessings received, and ask God to act in our lives and circumstances. What better way to do this than as a church family—adults, children, and youth; women and men—all pausing to pray at the same time each day, whether at home, at school, at work, at play, or on the move? The ACTS framework helps shape prayers that are not only personal but communal, grounded, and faithful.

419 Prays is therefore a call for the whole church to “*pray without ceasing*” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). It is an invitation to trust that when God’s people unite in prayer, the windows of heaven are opened, the blessings of God flow freely, and all who witness the movement and experience God’s power will testify to it—continuing in prayer and rejoicing always in the Lord.

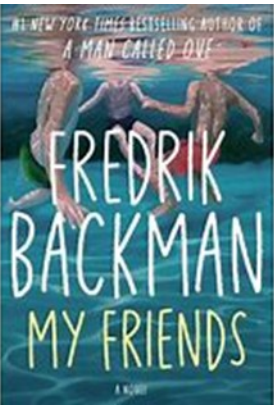

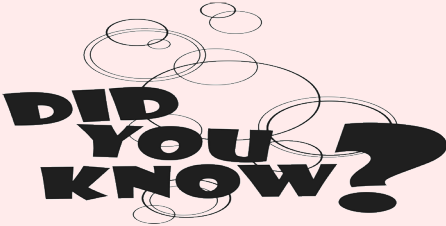

Did you know the Finance Committee reports the prior week’s offering to the General Fund as well as the expenses weekly in the bulletin? The total offering is the actual amount of money received for that week. The expenses reported are a product of the annual budget divided by 52 weeks. The 2025 budget was \$236,766. To support that budget there needed to be \$4,553.19 in giving each week. However, historically the Church has not spent the entire budgeted amount each year. Consequently, the weekly expense amount reported is reduced by the average percentage not spent in the prior 5 years. In 2025 \$198,533.20 of the budget was spent. About 16% of what was budgeted was not spent. Our committees and staff are good stewards of our financial resources. In the newsletter the monthly giving and expenses are reported. Those are the actual amounts received and spent for the prior month. Some members give monthly and others give weekly. Some expenses happen every month and some only quarterly or once per year. Utility costs vary by season and sometimes there are unexpected expenses. These are variables. It has been brought to my attention that some members are questioning the reported numbers. If you have any questions, please talk to Liz Rajkowski in Church or call her at 412-780-6873.

NEWS FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee and the leadership of Oakmont United Methodist Church would like to update the congregation on the end of year gifts received to support the General Fund. The gifts are as follows:

End of year giving campaign = \$7,285.00

Christmas Offering = \$4,385.00

United Methodist Women gift = \$6,841.75

The total received was \$18,511.75. The General Fund ended the year with a positive balance of \$6,109.06 so there is no need to withdrawal funds from the Endowment Account at this time. Praise God for the blessings our Church has received and for each one of you who made this possible.

A special thank you to the United Methodist Women (UMW) for the gift of \$6,841.75. This is the balance they had in their checking account as the organization has closed their account and has become inactive. Throughout the years, the UMW has worked tirelessly on behalf of the Church and supported the mission of the church, financially and otherwise. As they close this chapter of their organization, we pray for a new start for the UMW in the near future.
