Education on Sark

Sark School provides education for the Island's children from the ages of 3 (optional) or 5 (compulsory) to the age of 13 (Year 8).

Sark School

Sark School aims to ensure that pupils are both engaged and challenged in their learning, using a wide variety of teaching strategies, skills and up-to-date learning resources. Small class sizes mean that Sark School is able to provide an individualised and bespoke curriculum, always placing the child at the centre of every decision that is made. Sark School provides a first class, all-round education for the Island's children, supported by the highest standards of pastoral care. The Sark School team strive to offer children the chance to achieve in all areas. The school opens its doors to the local community for its enrichment programme, tapping into the very best skills the Island has to offer enables Sark School pupils to broaden their horizons and learn new skills, whilst also placing the school at the centre of the Island's community.

13+ Education

When young people reach the end of Year 8 (13 years), they currently complete their education off-island or parents can opt to home-educate. Whilst the Island of Sark pays for the children's schooling in Guernsey, the cost of accommodation and travel falls to the parents. For pupils who have attended Sark School for all or most of their education before the move to Guernsey, the Government of Sark contributes financially (on a graduated scale) to the cost of accommodation and travel. As an example, please see the scale below and the charges. The scale may be altered at any time and parents will be charged in accordance with the latest scale agreed by the Education Committee of Chief Pleas. Invoices to parents are raised by the Treasurer on a termly basis and must be paid to the Treasurer within 30 days of invoice date. Interest may be incurred on the late payment of invoices.

Sark students join their new school at the beginning of Year 9. Sark students usually stay with host families during term time. Host families are volunteers from the Guernsey community and are not always available in which case alternative solutions will need to be sought. During the winter months, travel disruptions often mean that Sark children stay in Guernsey at weekends too, but in summer months they are able to travel home on a Friday evening and return to Guernsey on a Sunday evening.

Sark may, at its discretion, contribute towards boarding fees for a UK state school, where the tuition is free.

Children Electively Educated at Home

The parents of a very small number of children choose to electively educate their sons and daughters at home. In Sark, the Education Committee is responsible for ensuring that every child, whether they are educated at school or at home, receive an efficient full-time education suitable to his or her age, ability and to any special educational needs which he/she may have. This means that every family who chooses to educate their children at home will undergo an assessment of suitability of education and safeguarding, and receive regular visits from representatives of the Education Committee. Children who are electively educated at home may take examinations as private candidates at Les Beaucamps High School in Guernsey. The cost of approved examination entry at a school in Guernsey is met by the government. Parents can choose to make alternative arrangements for examinations at their own cost.

Post-16

Children leave school at the end of the academic year in which they are 16 years old, or on the last Friday in June of that year, whichever is the sooner. Post-16 education is not provided or funded by the Island.

Moving to Sark

The Sark Education Committee has a legal responsibility to ensure that all children living in Sark between the ages of 5 and 16 are receiving efficient full-time education suitable to their age, ability and any special educational needs which they may have, either by regular attendance at school or elsewhere.

It also has a responsibility to oversee the safeguarding of any child being educated on Sark, other than at Sark School. If you are moving to the Island, or have already moved and are educating your child(ren) at home, please fill in a registration form (one per child) and send to the Education Committee education@sarkgov.co.uk.

If you have children under the age of 16 years and are intending to enrol your child in Sark School, please contact the School Administrator on admin@sarkschool.co.uk. She will ensure that you have all the information that you need and arrange a meeting with the Head of School (if your child is of Sark School age).
