Electricity Price Decrease From 1st April 2026

The maximum unit price that Sark Electricity Limited (“SEL”) can charge for electricity will decrease from 60 p/unit to 56 p/unit from the 1st April 2026.

The maximum unit price in the Price Control Order is set at 52 p/kwh but this can be adjusted monthly to account for changes in demand and fuel prices compared to the original forecast.

The price had increased to 60 p/kwh for February and March 2026 because of a 12-15 percent drop in demand compared to the forecast for the months October 2025 - January 2026. For February 2026 demand was only 6% less than forecast and this explains why the price for April 2026 will reduce to 56 p/kwh.

It is not possible to say for sure what will happen to prices in the months ahead because we do not know for certain what future demand and fuel prices will be. However, international fuel prices have risen significantly in recent weeks due to the war in the Middle-East, and this is likely to feed through to a higher maximum unit price for May 2026
