## Travel Information for Bailiwick vessels

If you, or any crew has visited a category 3 or 4 region within the last 14 days before arrival in the Bailiwick the procedures and restrictions for the higher category will **apply to all crew members** on your vessel. must:

Register your journey on the Travel Tracker within 2 days prior to arrival in the Bailiwick.

In all cases, if you are required to isolate at a nominated address, rather than on a self-isolation pontoon, you should travel directly from your mooring to that address by your own vehicle or a taxi (**not** using public transport, walking or cycling), keeping the windows open, using hand-sanitiser, wearing a face covering and maintaining as much social distance from the driver as possible and 2 metres from all other personnel.

Proceed to St Peter Port harbour or Braye Harbour for clearance

Make your way to the self-isolation pontoons

Take a day of arrival test and self-isolate until negative results are received for everyone in the party

If you are advised to proceed to your permanent mooring, you must go directly from your mooring to your home address and await the test result

Continue in passive follow-up until Day 14, with a further test at day 7

Covid tests are chargeable at £25 per test

Testing facilities open between 09:00-11:00 and 16:00-18:00 only

You must wear a face covering when proceeding to and from the testing facility

You will not be able to access shower and heads facilities until you have received a negative test result and should ensure you have enough food and water for all crew members - test results may take up to 48 hours depending on the volume being processed
