Legal requirement imposed by the Civil Contingencies Authority to self-isolate for 14 days on arrival in Alderney or Sark from Guernsey

Under regulation 6(2) of the Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (General Provision) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Regulations, 2021 ("**the 2021 Regulations**"), with effect from and including 26th January 2021 until further notice, any person who arrives in Alderney or Sark from Guernsey must self-isolate for 14 days. Under regulation 6(7) of the 2021 Regulations, where this requirement applies in respect of a child, a person who is a responsible adult in relation to that child must ensure that the child complies with this requirement so far as that person is reasonably able to do so.

This requirement is subject to the power of the Medical Officer of Health under regulation 6(3) of the 2021 Regulations to vary it in relation to particular cases.

Under regulation 14(2) of the 2021 Regulations, any person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with this requirement (and, subject to regulation 14(3), that person's employer), commits a criminal offence, and is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £10,000, a term of imprisonment not exceeding 14 days, or both.

Under regulation 14(5) of the 2021 Regulations, a person who is a responsible adult in relation to a child in respect of whom this requirement applies who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with regulation 6(7) commits a criminal offence, and is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £2,000.

For the purposes of this requirement, "**self-isolate**" and "**responsible adult**" have the meanings given in the 2021 Regulations.
