Electricity Price Increase From 1st June 2026 to 66 p/kwh

The maximum unit price which SEL is allowed to charge will increase from 62p/kwh to 66 p/kwh from the 1st of June 2026.

This revised price compares to a maximum unit price of 52 p/kwh that was set in the new price control order from October 2025.

This price increase has been caused by a 69% increase in diesel prices and a 13% drop in consumption, compared to the forecasts in the price control order. Under the terms of that order, these risks are borne by consumers rather than by SEL.

Connection charges remain unchanged.

It is impossible to say what will happen to diesel prices in the months ahead, although a key factor will be developments in the war in the Middle East.

This price increase also demonstrates how exposed Sark is to diesel prices with its current electricity generation technology.
