Mary Ray is a former associate editor for *Threads Magazine* and currently is teaching apparel design at Appalachian State University in Boone, NC. She continues to be a regular contributor to *Threads*. Mary is one of the most creative and innovative sewing enthusiasts of our time. She is a fiber artist, as well as skilled sewist. Some of her recent *Threads* contributions are in Issues 195,191, and 183. We will have two days to learn and be "in awe" of her creations. Mary doesn't use fancy techniques or stitches to create her designs. She sews with straight and zig-zag stitches.

On Friday, we will have her trunk show, starting at 10 am. After lunch Mary will instruct the group on effectively combining fabric and patterns so they are compatible. Color, texture, weight, hand, fibers, and more will be addressed. Saturday's class will be a hands-on session on distinctive details you can use to enhance your garments. The class will make samples as we learn topstitching details, unique closures, functional and decorative pockets, interesting facings, edge finishes and much more. A \$20 kit fee will be payable to instructor on Saturday.

Linda gave a demonstration on foundation paper piecing. She showed us how to make a beautiful placement. We also talked about english paper piecing.



"Elegance is when the inside is as beautiful as the outside;" and "The best color in the whole world is the one that looks good on you." These statements reflect our coming year in Garment Group — "Sewing for Your Lifestyle."
Instead of focusing on a particular gar-

ment or style, we will be focusing in on our individual lifestyles and creating a wearable and functional wardrobe that reflects our personality and life activities. For example, some of us travel a lot and need an easy-packing/wearing capsule wardrobe. Or we are retired and need a casual wardrobe that makes us feel good and not shabby... a girl still wants to look good at the Piggly Wiggly, of course! Or maybe we are still working and need a professional wardrobe. Mostly we will focus on building a wardrobe instead of making clothes. Our clothing items should work with each other, mix and match as much as possible – not just hang in the closet waiting to be worn. In January (1/19/19), we will kick of the year by watching a "Travel Wardrobe" video. We will continue the prepping process in February (2/16/19) by watching the Nancy Nix-Rice class on building a wardrobe considering color and style. We also be doing our measurements in February. I hope that you can join us!



When Googled: A Podcast is "SIMPLY PUT, A PODCAST IS TALK RADIO, BUT ON DEMAND." It's a series of spoken, audio episodes, often focused on a particular topic or theme, like sewing, fashion or current events. You can subscribe to the podcast show with an app on your phone and listen to episodes whenever you like on your headphones, in the car or through speakers.

An app? What apps are available to download or stream podcasts? Personally, I use TuneIn Radio. It's free and you can download from your App Store/Site on your cellular phone. I have an iPhone and I stream my podcasts. I don't download to my phone's memory because I don't want to use my phone's memory that way. So...I stream via internet connection or data through my carrier (Verizon). If you choose to stream via data, typical rates will apply per your provider (I have plenty of data per month so I'm not concerned). Plus, I'm usually listening at night and hooked into my homes Wi-Fi). Other ways to listen to podcasts? ITunes; Stitcher; The Podcast App.; or Castbox There are a lot, I'm sure. Still, I stick with TuneIn because it's free and simple.

Once you download your Podcast App of choice, you can search

that was started at the Give Back Event in September. Lexi and Cailyn now have all the fins completed and ready for project assembly at the January meeting.


What's Ahead:

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
