We also experienced the loss of our 16-foot box truck in November and a failure of one of our walk-in coolers in December. Thank God we live such a beautiful community, because after asking for donations to replace the truck and fix the cooler, we were able to raise the funds for both.

We could not have done it without the generous donations of so many businesses, organizations, and individuals. The cooler has been repaired and a new truck has been ordered and soon will be delivered.

Thanks to consistent donations from individuals and local businesses, Agape House has been able to host a parking lot sale on the third Saturday of each month for several years. This is a benefit to many local families who can find great bargains on gently used clothing and household items, and also acts a fundraiser for our ministry.

Thanks to some new donation resources, we have added a weekly **Mini Treasures popup shop** in the Altrusa Room of Agape House. These also provide affordable clothing and goods to many families in our community.

Finding a Home Through Martha's House

Martha's House was designed from the beginning to be a drug-free transitional family housing program, a place where people can find the structure and support to learn valuable life skills and build a stable lifestyle.

As much as we love to welcome new families into the house, our mission is to help them overcome obstacles, build confidence and stability, and transition into a place of their own. We have had many success stories in the past year of people who have successfully found steady employment and housing and are now doing well on their own.

This is possible because of the generous support of the community. Multiple churches and community organizations have volunteered to sponsor rooms with household goods for new families who move in.



Ella Vore, a young lady from Victory Baptist, took it upon herself to collect household supplies and toys to donate to Martha's House. Her church family has also sponsored a room.

We're also excited to have received a grant from the Good Shepherd Community Health Foundation to fund a fence

around the yard of the property. This will create a safe place for children in the house to run and play.
