A very warm welcome to our new and existing colleges and schools' partners and the British and international students taking part in MACFEST 2025.



Later we venture into Oman's desert interior to experience the lush valley of Wadi Shab and the vast wilderness of Wahiba Sands. The final part of our adventure brings us to the ancient city of Nizwa and the verdant Jebel Akhdar region before we make our way back to Muscat.


