The Last of the Lascars: Yemeni Communities in Britain

This presentation charts the fascinating and little known history of Britain's oldest Muslim community.

Originally arriving as imperial oriental sailors and later postcolonial labour migrants. Yemeni Muslims have lived in British ports and industrial cities from the mid-nineteenth century, marrying local British wives, establishing a network of 'Arab-only' boarding houses and cafes. They also established Britain's first mosques and religious community in the early twentieth century, encountering racism, discrimination and even deportation in the process.

This original research publication brings together the unique narratives and events of the chronology of a British Muslim community that stretches across 170 years of UK history from empire to modern multicultural Britain.



Silk Painting Workshop

Join us for an exciting silk painting with Aysha Yilmaz!

In this workshop, motifs and designs from The Silk Road: such as Iran, Uzbekistan and Turkey will be used to produce a silk painting. A briefing will be given by Aysha on how silk is produced and its origins. Also, she will touch upon the origins of the motifs used.

Avsha will demonstrate how to apply the design on to the silk fabric from a drawing, followed by techniques of filling in with silk paints.

Materials needed for this workshop are:

- Silk fabric piece: at least A4 size, or a plain white silk scarf (these can be bought online).
- 3-6 silk paint colours, Marabu (online shop) has a good range of colours.
- Silk painting gutta/liner tube in gold colour
- Paper, pencil and a rubber.

Limit of 25 people for this workshop.
