Ottoman Encounters, Henrietta Liston's Travels and Turkish Responses - Hello from Scotland!

Tickets: Free, register on Eventbrite Join us to explore Henrietta Liston's Regency-era encounters with Ottoman women, together with responses to her writings 200 years later by figures such as Turkish novelist and political commentator Ece Temelkuran and botanical illustrator Işık Güner.

Thanks in part to their colonial legacies, Scottish libraries often hold surprisingly rich collections of material produced by and for Muslim women. But Muslim women most often appear in our archives in the accounts of Western writers and travellers, where they may be left voiceless, misrepresented, and orientalised. This presents libraries and readers with difficult questions and challenges.

Henrietta Liston – diplomat's consort, travel writer and botanist – resided in Istanbul from 1812 to 1820. Her journals and letters, held in the National Library of Scotland's Liston Papers Archive, describe in detail her encounters with Ottoman women, their arts, crafts and cuisine, the harem, Ottoman religious practices, and the Empires minority communities.

This event will look at Liston's travel writing in the light of some of the questions the Archive raises, and set it alongside creative twenty-first century responses by Turkish women.
