Message from Pastor

I was installed as the pastor of Bethlehem and St. John Ev. Lutheran Churches on June 9, 2019 after a vacancy of eight months. In an effort to shore up the banks of our Lutheran confessions and practice, several changes were implemented over the course of 2019. These include, but are not limited to:

1. Committing to visiting all of the shut-ins each month.

2. Scheduling an adult education class called "Christian Foundations" to be held once a year at each church. The first was held at Bethlehem from Sept – Dec 2019 and the next will be held at St. John beginning Feb 13.

3. Restarting the Confirmation Class after the hiatus, with a renewed emphasis on memory work and individual readiness and less on specific timetables.

4. Introducing several orders of worship from the Lutheran Service Book which had either not been used in some years or had never been introduced.

5. Introducing a Dual Parish Reformation Celebration, to alternate between the two congregations each October. The first was held at St. John on Oct 27, 2019 and attendance was 48 (with members of both congregations).

6. Encouraging Council members to use Church 360 in the course of their official duties.

7. Introducing a study of the Book of Concord to the monthly Elders Meeting.


8. Introducing e-giving at both congregations

9. Introducing weekly communion with the beginning of Advent, Dec. 1, 2019.

The Elders and I have been working since last summer to identify delinquent members and encourage them to either return to church or transfer to their nearest LCMS congregation if they have moved. Keeping the membership roles up to date is not only a matter of honesty, but it is necessary since lapsed members can prevent a quorum from being reached during important decisions by the Voters' Assembly. Many of these have not been in church for several years.

The Elders and I will continue to address this situation over the coming months. Understand that the goal is always to bring about repentance and bring all to Christ. We want all members to be in church, where God pours out His gifts through the Means of Grace. But allowing people who refuse to come to church, who refuse to gather with their fellow Christians, who despise preaching and God's Word, to remain on the membership role is dishonest. Worse than that, it gives a poor witness to God's Word. Even if someone is removed from membership, they are always welcome to return. "As I live, declares the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way and live". (Ezekiel 33:11)

This was my own experience when youth to attend the Higher Things conference in Grand Rapids this coming July. Higher Things is an organization run by confessional Lutheran pastors to teach and encourage our youth to "Dare to Be Lutheran". There are four conferences each year, with two usually held in the Midwest. I have taught at a Higher Things conference in the past and will do so again in the future. Please consider encouraging your own children and grandchildren to attend.

Giving this year has been sporadic, which is one of the reasons for implementing e-giving. It will not be mandatory, just one of the ways in which you can give. You can set it up to give twice a month (or whatever frequency you choose) and it will be done automatically, even if you are on vacation or forget your checkbook. I encourage you all to examine your own giving. The examples we have from Scripture are instructive: The Hebrews were required to tithe (that is, give 10%) for the maintenance of the tabernacle and the support of the priesthood. The New Testament witness is that some Christians sold all they had and gave it to the church (Acts 4:32-37). Since we have been given greater gifts than the Hebrews through our Baptism, it is fitting that we should respond to God's grace in a manner greater than them. For Christians, 10% is not the maximum but the starting point for giving. If you don't think you can give 10% this year, start with a lower amount, then increase it each year by 1%. As you give more each year, you will find that you are not struggling to make ends meet, but in fact

I first started tithing years ago. I urge you to reexamine your priorities and prayerfully consider giving regularly and proportionally to support the church. We should not be motivated by fear, for God provides all good things to His children. As St. Paul wrote, "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor 9:7) We are to trust in His promises, confident that He will continue to pour out His blessings upon us.

My family has been warmly welcomed to Wisconsin and it has been a joy to serve you these past eight months. My vocabulary has been expanded (flowage, stop-and-go light, Chequamegon, popple) and we are discovering the joys and nuances of cheese and sausage. As we continue to walk together let us remember the letter to the Hebrews:

"Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:1-2)

Dear Pastor and Church Council:

For many years the fund started back in 1988 by Trinity to sponsor the Sunday broadcasts of the Lutheran Hour over Marshfield station WDLB 1450AM at 8:00am held steady. We had many people who would annually sponsor a broadcast, so the fund itself did not need to be used very much. As the years have gone by, these faithful sponsors have gone on to their reward and there have not been enough others to replace them.

We are asking if your congregants would like to help with this worthwhile mission.
