Message from Pastor

Who tracked this good soil into church?

[Jesus said], "Hear then the parable of the sower: When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is what was sown along the path. As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, yet he has no root in himself, but endures for a while, and when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately he falls away. As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful. As for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it. He indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty." (Matthew 13:18-23)

A common refrain I am hearing both from members and from other pastors is "What if people don't come back to church when all this is over?" This virus is not unique. There have been many calamities both natural and manmade that have caused people to stop going to church for a while. But in the past fifty years there has arisen the Church Growth Movement, which seeks to increase the size of a church by any means necessary. The focus is solely on numbers, not on doctrine, not on fidelity to God's Word and certainly not to our Lutheran Confessions. As long as a given congregation is increasing in size, no matter what shenanigans they pull to make that happen, they are considered "successful", and any decrease is seen as failure.

But that is not at all the way Jesus sees things. In fact, He warned His disciples against this view many times. The Parable of the Sower (or better, the Parable of the Soils) explains this clearly. Some who hear the word do not receive it at all because the devil works hard to lead them astray. Some receive the Word eagerly but are quick to fall away at the slightest trouble in their life. These are the seeds cast on the rock path, those who have no depth of soil and are quickly scorched by the sun. The third type of soil is that choked with weeds and thorns, when the world leads them astray and strangles their faith with other cares.

The last type, the good soil, is where the Word of God takes root and flourishes, producing abundant fruit. This is not to be understood as three types of people who don't come to church and one type that does. No, these four types of soil are found in every congregation as well as outside of it. We often cannot tell which type of soil we are dealing with until they bear fruit... or don't. But unlike the hardworking farmers in our congregations, Jesus instructs us to be <u>careless sowers</u>, casting our seed wide. We aren't supposed to try to determine where the good soil is nor be stingy with our application of seed. We are simply to sow.

So will people come back to church? That's the wrong question. Am I sharing the Good News of Jesus with everyone? Am I loving and forgiving others as God bids me to do? Do we continue to gather in worship around the Means of Grace that God provides for us? That is really the only thing we need to concern ourselves with because we know that God will take care of the growth and He will bring in His harvest in due time.

Return to Regular Services in July



At the June Council meetings, both congregations decided to open up worship attendance beginning in July. This means there will be no restrictions on the number of people in attendance and you no longer need to call ahead to sign up (just when we got you all trained...). We will still prac-

tice the recommended spacing by using every other pew, limiting the number of people at each communion table to six people, and will be sanitizing the common surfaces after each service. The virus has not gone away

and there may never be a vaccine, so each person must determine how they are going to live with this in a prudent but fearless way. We are not authorized to be afraid. Jesus said, "Fear not" (Matt 10:31) and that applies to every situation in our lives, big or small.

With the services opened up, this means we can reduce the number of services and go back to our normal worship times. So starting Sunday, July 5 the services will be:

We will continue to record the services for the website throughout the summer, so if you are not comfortable coming back to church right now, or if you yourself get sick, you Those who signed up this year will have first chance for can continue to hear the Word of God with us.

Home Visits on Request

We have members of both congregations who have not been able to come to church or received visits from the pastor since March. Some of these members who are in institutions (nursing homes, memory care centers, assisted living facilities) which are in lockdown to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. 




