Message from Pastor

Innocent as Doves

[Jesus said], “A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant above his master. It is enough for the disciple to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household.” (Matthew 10:24-25)

Last week a church in Mississippi was burned to the ground by someone who objected to them gathering to worship. Spray-painted on the ground was the message “*Bet you stay home now you hypokrits*”, along with a symbol used by certain atheist groups. Here in Marathon County, the police were called on churches who were gathering to worship – called out by their own neighbors – even though they were following the same guidelines used elsewhere. News articles are quick to mock Christians who get sick, as if they deserve it. *Ha, the pastor who said “Don’t be afraid” has died! That showed him!* But that only proves two things: A: That they have nothing but hatred in their own hearts and B: That they didn’t understand what the pastor was saying... what Jesus our Lord was saying.

Our Lord warned that we would be hated and attacked for bearing His name. In the first few centuries after our Lord’s Ascension, Christians were routinely attacked by both the government and by mobs. One of the charges against Christians was that they were disturbing the peace (see Acts 17:1-9). The angry mobs were deemed to be *their* fault and Jason had to post a bond against *the mob’s* behavior. Another common charge leveled at Christians was that they were “atheists” because they dared to say there was only one God. The charges change over time, but not the reason behind them. The hatred they feel towards Christians was there all along, bubbling below the surface. They hate us because they first hated Him.

We will probably see more of this in the coming months. There will be more localized outbreaks of the virus – of course, because it didn’t disappear – and Christians will be blamed because they gather to worship the only true God. We make easy targets because we do not fight back. As Jesus said, “**whoever does not take his cross and follow Me is not worthy of Me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for My sake will find it.**” (Mt 10:38-39) Bearing the name of Jesus may only earn us scorn in this world, but in the world to come it brings joy and everlasting life.

We’re not out of the woods yet... and I’m not talking about the coronavirus. I’m talking about our lives as Christians. We are to take up our cross daily and be ready to explain to anyone the reason for the hope that is in us, including to enemies. Why do we act differently than everyone else? Because we believe differently. Our faith is not in man, in government or in “Science”, but in the Triune God. What Christ did for us shows the deep love of God for us all and that knowledge banishes fear, kindles hope and overwhelms us with His love.



BIBLE PASSAGE — He put before them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.'" ...

Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!
