Message from Pastor

It's almost impossible to miss how the world around us tries to push the start of the so-called "Christmas Season" to an earlier and earlier time each year. Retail businesses begin selling decorations as early as the middle of October or even the end of September, and as December 25<sup>th</sup> gets closer and closer their shouts of "Sale! Sale!" get more and more shrill. The Hallmark Channel begins their annual Christmas movie marathon at the beginning of November with nonstop Hallmark movies that have little to do with the actual reason for Christmas, and they can't seem to resist pushing that back a little bit each year with some of those same movies shown just before October ends or even previewed a bit for a special "Christmas in July" event. The radio stations begin broadcasting their collections of old and new Christmas songs on Thanksgiving night most years, and our old friends in the church of The Salvation Army begin placing their red kettles out a couple of weeks before that.

For a world that wants nothing to do with Christianity and that does its best to push it out of the public square, this incessant need to "get into 'the Christmas Spirit'" (whatever that is) earlier every year is puzzling to say the least. Attempts have been made year after year to do the same thing with Easter, but it never seems to reach the fever pitch that Christmas does. Maybe it's because of the happy feelings and nostalgia that are associated with it. Maybe the anticipation of getting newer and better stuff appeals to our innate and greedy desire to get more and more things. Maybe the time of year itself is the explanation as the shorter days and lower temperatures encourage people to seek after something that will make them feel better.

In reality it's probably a combination of all three of these reasons which ultimately find their basis in humanity's sinful nature. Now don't get me wrong, I'm not saying that it's sinful to enjoy the season or to watch the movies or listen to the music, and I'm not saying that we shouldn't begin to prepare for Christmas. In fact, that's what the season of Advent is all about, preparing for the Christmas celebration, but as Christians we are called and encouraged to be preparing for Christmas in a Christian way.

Advent (which we get from the Latin word, *adventus*, which means "coming") is the season that prepares us for Christmas as it focuses on a progression from darkness to light. During this season we anticipate the second coming of Jesus, and we prepare to celebrate His first coming as the very Light of the world that pierces the darkness of sin. Christians prepare together for this special celebration with special times of prayer and devotion. (*This year you can join us at St. John at 1:30pm or at Bethlehem at 7:00pm. Hope we see you there, and be sure to look into one or more of the different ways to use this year's special Advent devotions from the Higher Things Lutheran youth organization.)* 

History shows us that the season of Advent has been a part of the Christian calendar year since 550 AD. We believe that when Christians come together to worship here on earth we are joining together with not just the people sitting in the pews, but with the believers in Christ who have lived throughout all of human history. When you pray the Lord's Prayer, you are joining with the apostles who were first taught those words by Jesus Himself. When you kneel at the communion rail it is not just you and God, but you join together with Christian believers from all of history, and from all over the world. You join with "...all of the company of heaven" to receive the gifts of God. And when you join with us here on Wednesday evenings and on Sunday mornings during this Advent season you will participate once again in the longing prayer of the Church throughout all of human history to say, "Amen. Come quickly, Lord Jesus! Amen!"

Nov. 15, 2022

Pastor opened the meeting with prayer.

Attending were Doug Brown, Kay Christiansen, Sharon Niemann, Mel Niemann, Anna Koepke, Stephan Schnieder, Pastor Mathey, and Jeff Werner.

Pastor's report included that catechism class was starting at Bethlehem on the 16'th. This would continue until the first of the year when it would be held at St John. Services will be held at both churches for Thanksgiving and Advent begins on Nov. 30'th. Pastor introduced a group that could help us as a congregation protect our legal standing in our belief system through our church document. This would protect us from law suits. More information will be available in the future.

Elders are looking into specific policies for weddings, funerals, and the use of our facilities. They are concerned with the legal issues that could be coming up as well. Pete is working on the cry room monitor and sound for the services. We may need a new TV installed to view the service.

Outreach team continues to record the services and put them on the websight. The next blood drive is Dec. 28 here. Watch for a date and time for the all church caroling.

Treasurer gave a report that reflected health insurance paid to cover 3 months at once. So that gave us an extremely high expense total; but it was a "one time" catch up expense. All bills are current.

Trustees reported that doorbells are in at both main doors. Christmas bags will be made up for the Children's program on the 18'th of Dec. If you wish to contribute to the cost of them; please give the money to Anna Koepke or Ryan VanDerLeest.

Finance Committee reports that they will need 2 counters for next year.

All reports were approved.

Old Business: The board made a recommendation that we hire the Alliance Defending Freedom for one year to review our church documents in order to prevent legal problems. Motion was made, seconded and passed.

A surge protector is being researched for the organ.

New Business: A check was received from the Adam Hoppenworth family as a thankyou in response to our help with the Levi fund. It will be used to help in childrens' ministry or helping hands as we see the need. Action to be taken in the Dec. meeting. Thank you note was sent back to the family.

Motion was made to get a new computer for the treasurer. Dean has been unable to deal with the problems. Second and passed. Old one will be cleaned and passed on to finance.

We will look for someone to act as leader for the church directory. This person will search companies and consider making one on our own. Notice will be put in the bulletin.

Then he called a little later and got me on the phone. He explained that his wife was in the nursing home and that he would really appreciate a meal. He said he could drive up and get it. I assured him that we would deliver it. After he received his meal and ate it. He called back to let us know that it was wonderful. "So much meat!" "Homemade pie, because he can tell when it's homemade!" Thanked us again for serving him.

Mel and Sharon Niemann had the following

comments:

We met several interesting people when we made deliveries. First was a lady with a walker. Very slow moving. Obviously not able to drive. Asked if her bag could be put on her walker so she could scoot it to her table. Amazingly grateful.

Then, we met another gal who could not lift her bag with 2 meals in it and asked if we would just put it in the kitchen for her. Again, so grateful and generous with their support.

Deliveries are a real eye opener as to how some people live and get around so poorly. It helps us see how truly blessed we are.

We learned that the deliveries were so important as many that got the meals would never have been able to come to our church for a dinner. So, when we get discouraged thinking that we didn't do it well enough, we need to remember that we are spreading the love of Jesus by providing for those less fortunate. This is why we do it.
