Stephan opened the meeting with reading Psalm 16.

Minutes were approved as previously published.

Elders report was that Pastor Ludholz would fill in each first Sunday of the month until we get our own pastor.

The Outreach team has gotten more information on the church sign. We could go Solar to just have it lit and the maximum height is to be no more than 6 feet. Mel met again with Planning and Zoning of Marathon County and we will need a survey of the sign location. This will be done only after the land owner approves that as well.

Note from the Board of Ed. Reminded everyone that the last day of Sunday School would be May 15. Graduation recognition would be that same day.

Treasurers' report was given and approved. We are still in a positive cash flow. No bills from the parsonage damage have come in yet.

Trustees sent word that there is some finish work and painting to be done yet in the parsonage; but other than that, we are nearly finished.

IBLE PASSAGE — Now I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain. For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.


