Congregation sings: Oh, Come, All Ye Faithful LSB 379

Nicholas: God’s love once again permits us to hear the old but ever new story of Christmas. We are pleased to present it to you from scripture in song and recitation. It is the story of the birthday of the promised Savior, Jesus, who is God's Christmas gift of love to all the world.

On that first Christmas night so long ago, the angels and the shepherds worshipped Him as He lay cradled in a manger. Today we who by faith know Him as our Savior, once again kneel in spirit at the same manger. May God the Holy Spirit fill our hearts and sanctify our lips as we come before His presence with thanksgiving and sing praises to His holy name.

**Congregation sings: Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel
(verses 1-2) LSB 357**

Lauren: We rejoice today because we are celebrating the birthday of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Because Jesus was born, there can be peace and gladness in the hearts of men. Jesus brought true happiness by saving us from sin, death, and the devil. All men needed to be saved because our first parents, Adam and Eve, fell into sin. Sin is breaking God’s holy Law. The bible says: “There is no difference, for all have sinned and come short of the glory of God,” Romans 3: 22 and 23. St. Paul tells us: “The wages of sin is death,” Romans 6:23.

Kassidy: In spite of our sins, God loves us and wants all men to be saved. The bible tells us that “For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life,” John 3:16.

God showed his love first to Adam and Eve. For he promised them a savior shortly after they had fallen into sin. In his first gospel promise, God warned the devil: “ I will put enmity between thee and the woman and between thy seed and her seed; It shall bruise thy head and thou shalt bruise his heel,” Genesis 3:15.

Speaking of the coming Savior, God said to Abraham in Genesis 22:18:

Kaysley: “In your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice,”

Cale: Through Moses God promised: “The Lord, your God, will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brothers—it is to Him you shall listen—,” Deuteronomy 18:15.

Isaiah foretold the Virgin Birth when he wrote: “Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel,” Isaiah 7:14.

Isaiah further described the coming Savior when he said: “For to us a Child is born, to us a Son is given; and the government shall be upon His shoulder, and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace,” Isaiah 9:6.

Sam: Isaiah also prophesied the suffering and death of Jesus when he said: “Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His wounds we are healed,” Isaiah 53:4 and 5.

These are but a few of the glorious Old Testament promises which tell of God’s gift of love, Jesus. God used these promises to comfort His people of long ago, for they, too, needed a Savior from sin. And after all the prophets had, Christmas came to earth, and Christ was born just as the prophets had foretold.

Congregation sings: O Little Town of Bethlehem LSB 361

Colin: The real Christmas story is a joyful story. St. Luke tells it in the second chapter of his Gospel.

“In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.”

Congregation sings: Silent Night LSB 363

Ben: “And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them,

Annabell: “Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger.”

Ben: And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

Angels: “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!”

Ben: When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another,

Shepherds: “Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us.”

Ben: And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.”

This simple, beautiful story brings true joy and happiness to men wherever it is told and believed, for it shows God's perfect love for sinful men. Let us now join the shepherds in humble worship of the Christ Child as we sing.

"Away in a Manger" (Children sing)

Marcus: Throughout this wonderful gift of God's love we have received all spiritual blessings: forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Jesus saved us from our sins by perfectly fulfilling the law for us and by suffering and dying in our stead.
