From the Pastor's Desk A TALE OF THREE MARTINS

Remembered On Three Consecutive November Days
On November 11th, the Christian Church remembers Saint Martin of Tours, pastor and bishop. Martin was born into an unbelieving family in what is today know as Hungary around the

year 316 AD. He was the son of a senior officer in the Roman army, and moved to Lombardy when his father was transferred there. When he was about ten years old, Martin began to attend a local Christian church against his parent's wishes, and he soon enrolled in classes to become a fully confirmed member of the faith. When he was about 15, Martin was drafted into the cavalry according to the custom of the time for sons of officers to serve in the Roman military. Three years later, he was sent to the region of Gaul in what we now call France.

Martin's charity for the poor was well known even from his time as a soldier. He once saw a poor beggar dressed in tattered rags on a cold winter's day, and used his sword to slice his own cloak into two parts. While he kept one part for himself, the other part was given to the freezing beggar to wrap up in against the cold. In the course of his military service, a time came when Martin felt that he could not join in a particular battle. He proclaimed to his superiors that, "I am a soldier of Christ." He was immediately arrested and jailed, but it turned out that the anticipated battle never occurred because the enemy sued for peace instead. Martin was released from prison not long after, and he was discharged from any further military service. That allowed him to pursue his study of the Christian faith, and in 371 he was declared the Bishop of Tours where he faithfully and tirelessly served until his death on November 11, 397.

A little more than 1000 years later, on November 10, 1483, a son was born to Hans and Margaret Luther in Eisleben, Germany. They baptized their newborn boy the very next day, on St. Martin's Day, and gave him the name of Martin Luther in honor of the famous St. Martin, Bishop of Tours. This second Martin would become even more famous than the first when he posted 95 Theses on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany. From that day on his writings and efforts to reform errors in the Catholic Church would become the foundation for what is now called the Lutheran Church all over the world. Martin Luther is celebrated today for rediscovering the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ that we are saved by grace alone through faith alone, and for standing firm for that truth against enormous pressure from some of the most powerful men of his day. He died on February 18, 1546.

About 39 years after the birth of Martin Luther, a third Martin was born on November 9th. This man is often considered to be one of the greatest theologians that the Lutheran Church was ever blessed with, even though many don't know his name, Martin Chemnitz (the first part of his name is pronounced as you would the word, "chemistry"). His significance as a writer and teacher of the Christian faith was so great and influential, that it is undebatable that had Martin Chemnitz not been alive when Martin Luther died, the Lutheran Reformation would never have lasted.

Martin Chemnitz arrived in Wittenberg, Germany in 1545, and he learned from both Martin Luther and Philip Melanchthon (the writer of the Augsburg Confession and its Apology). He initially worked as a librarian which enabled him to read extensively even as he taught in order to earn a living. After several years of study both on his own and with the teachers in Wittenberg, he was ordained as a pastor on November 25, 1545. His extensive writings are still used in training pastors today, especially his works on the Lord's Supper and the Nature of Christ (Christology). After Luther's death, Chemnitz's leadership was key in keeping the work of the Reformation going, and his work is a major part of our confessional document known as the Formula of Concord. Martin Chemnitz died on November 8, 1586. — until next month, Pr. M.

Dual Parish Council Budget Meeting

September 18, 2025

President Linda Mueller called the meeting to order.

Roll call: Pastor Mathey, **Bethlehem:** President Alan Schmidt, **St. John:** President Linda Mueller, Treasurer Danni Helm, Dean Pehlke, Tabitha Hartwig

Minutes from 2024 Dual Parish Budget Meeting were reviewed with an amendment. A motion was made by Dean Pehlke to change \$331,778 to \$31,778 under Proposed Budget: under Health care. Alan Schmidt seconded the motion, all in favor, the motion passes.

New Business: Discussion about having more joint services. This idea will be brought up at the Dual Parish Voters' Meeting October 2025.

Health Care increased by 1.24% to \$32,172 (\$324 difference)

Total Salary and Benefits increased by 1.56% from \$118,840 to \$120,332

Copier (Quarterly Maintenance) increased by 150% from \$1,000 to \$2,500

Office Secretary Milage stayed the same at \$500

Office Secretary FICA stayed the same at \$700

Computers stayed the same at \$1,000

Worker's Comp stayed the same at \$1,000

Total Office Expenses increased by 10.05% from \$19,900 to \$21,900

Total Parsonage Expenses including heating and septic stayed the same at \$3,500

Total Education Expenses including Adult Bible Study, Portals of Prayer & Confirmation

Ministry increased by 79.08% from \$1,530 to \$2,740 (increase was due to adding Portals of Prayer to this category

Total Copyright Expenses stayed the same at \$650

Pastoral Services Expenses stayed the same at \$2,000

Professional Expenses stayed the same at \$500

Continuing Education stayed the same at \$1,000

Convention Expense stayed the same at \$500

Total Budget increased by 3.47% from \$146,060 to \$151,122

Discussion was had in regard to Pastor's salary. A motion was made by Alan Schmidt to increase Pastor's salary to \$80,000 from \$77,000. Dean Pehlke seconded the motion, all were in favor, the motion passed.

Vote to accept the Budget as proposed passed.

St. John Treasurer's Report to Council and Voter's Meeting, October 19, 2025

This year \$45,000 has been raised for the repainting and refreshing of the Chapel. That amount will be deposited to the LCEF checking account to set it aside for those expenses in Winter 2026. A deposit of \$40,722 was already sent to the restoration contractor in August. The total cost of the project will be approximately \$123,499, plus costs in relation to the installation of new lighting. We are continuing to raise funds for the project.

Year - to - Date Balances through September 30th, 2025

- Restricted Funds receipts: \$61,364; Expenses: \$55,723; Balance remaining YTD: \$5642
- One Year Note Balance: \$53,833.64
- September General Fund Average Weekly Earnings: \$2484/week
- General Fund Receipts Year to Date: \$83,525
- General Fund Expenditures Year to Date: \$100,717 (All bills are paid)
- Shortfall of deposits vs. expenses in the General Fund Year to Date: (\$17,192)
- Approximately \$440 per week is needed in additional offerings to the General Fund plate in order to meet regular monthly operating expenses. Please consider increasing your offering if it is feasible and comfortable for you.
- The 2026 Budget Weekly Offerings needed to cover regular monthly expenses: \$2716/week

Weekly Giving Goal with the \$440 added to cover 2025 losses: \$3,156/week


