Message from Pastor

"It used to be that..." Have you ever made a point that started with that phrase or one that's similar to it? Most of the time it's said with nostalgia, and a desire to return to "the good old days" whenever that might be for the person saying it. "It used to be." We could make a list of how each of us would finish that thought, and some of those things would be important and some not.

Why did this phrase come to my mind as I was thinking about this month's newsletter article? Because, it used to be that Christians remembered the important days in the life of Christ and in the Church Year with a special time of worship. That was the case for the major Feast that happens 40 days after Easter Sunday, the Ascension of Our Lord. It used to be that most Christian Churches would have a special time of worship on the Thursday that Ascension Day always falls on (there will be a service at St. John for Ascension Day on May 29th!).

I can remember going to a special chapel service in the Lutheran School that I attended to celebrate this glorious event, and then another service for the whole congregation that evening. At the end of chapel each of us would be given a balloon with a card attached to it, and we would take it outside and let it go into the sky to provide a visual of Christ ascending into heaven. The card would have a Scripture verse attached to it, and a message to whoever found it to consider mailing it back to our school so we could see how far it had traveled.

Most of the time Ascension Day isn't given this kind of attention anymore. With all of the distractions in our world today, it just doesn't seem all that important to us. Busy schedules don't allow for a seemingly random worship time on a Thursday in the middle of a spring month, especially so soon after the extra worship times of Holy Week. And with no attention given to it at all by the world outside of the church it's easy to miss the importance of this special day.

But Ascension Day is an important event in the life of Jesus, even if we don't always get it. The book *Celebrating The Saints* by William Weedon helps us to remember this special day. He writes, "...forty days after Easter, the Holy Church celebrates with great joy the feast of the Ascension of Our Lord. The Book of Acts relates that after our Lord Jesus rose from the dead, He appeared to His disciples at various times across a period of forty days...He had work for them to do. He promised that He would pour out on them His Holy Spirit and in the Spirit's power they shall be His witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, and to the ends of the earth. Then, as they looked on, He was lifted up until a cloud hid Him from their sight. As they stared into the sky, perhaps with tears, two angels appeared to them..., "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw Him go into heaven" (Acts 1:11).

"Thus began the Church's long wait. The disciples would die before this promise was fulfilled. Generation after generation would arise in the Church and be succeeded by the next, and still the people of Christ wait. We wait because we know that He who has kept His every other promise to us will not fail to keep the promise of His final appearing. Meanwhile, we live as a community of faith in what is not seen, but what we know to be true. Jesus sits enthroned at the Father's right hand, filling all things with Himself and waiting with us for the Father to signal the moment of His joyous appearing. It is true that He has withdrawn His visible presence from us, but He is nevertheless truly with His Church to the end of the age. Hidden beneath His Means of Grace, He still comes to us. His Ascension did not take Him far; rather it brought heaven near, 'Behold, I am with you always,' He promised...the visible presence of Christ has withdrawn into His invisible presence in Word and Sacraments. [With our celebration of the Ascension] we join the ages [in celebrating His arrival at the Father's right hand and] in the long wait for Jesus' final appearing, [as we] are comforted by His constant nearness." – Pr. M.

We want to thank everyone for the thoughts, cards, prayers, donations, and outpour of love and support for Halie and our family. We are very grateful and feel very blessed to be part of such a great community.

As many know, Halie was recently diagnosed with Primary Aggressive Multiple Sclerosis and has numerous attacks that have affected her functioning and mobility. After a hospital stay in December followed by a round of Plasma Exchange therapy, Halie seemed to regain most of the functioning she lost and seemed to be doing better. Then in February the onset of another attack began which affected Halie's lower extremities and her mobility was affected. Once again requiring another hospital stay, getting her line back in and another round of Plasma Exchange Therapy.

We are thankful to say that the Plasma Exchange therapy once again seems to have helped reverse the effects of her most recent attack and her mobility again has improved. Finally approved by insurance, Halie had her first round of Ocrevus to prevent future attacks on March 12th. She's starting to get back to normal and feeling good! St. John Voters Meeting Reports

Treasurer Report: For the First Quarter of 2025, the General Fund Receipts were \$24,985; Restricted Funds were \$7974; and Bethlehem Reimbursements were \$8724; **total receipts:** \$41,683. The General Fund Expenses were \$30,928; Restricted Funds were \$1887; and Bethlehem expenses were \$8641; total expenses: \$41,456. The One Year Note at LCEF is now valued at \$51,737. Checking balance for Nicolet is \$52,963; LFCU is \$1033; and LCEF is \$53,954; TOTAL FUNDS on Account is \$107,950.

The District Q1 Remittance is as follows: \$3597 Budgeted to Synod; \$780 for Lutheran World Relief; \$137.75 for Hearts for Jesus through Sunday School Missions; and \$475 for "Other" Non-Budgeted District Missions; total remittance is **\$4989.75**. We still have the \$5000.00 from Wisconsin Valley Lutheran School that has not been designated yet. One of the suggestions was that we get a robotic vacuum . I was notified that our cleaning committee would like to continue with the current system and asked that that portion of the fund go to Vicar Paul Mroczenski. Please continue to think and pray on where these funds should go . The final decision as to what to do with the money will be made at the next voters meeting.

We did have some constitutional changes involving the terms of our officers and over the next several weeks I will be working on that update to our constitution.

Lastly, I would like to remind everyone that the Council Meeting are scheduled on the second Tuesday of the month are not just for board members. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend. A church like any organization works best when everyone is involved. We all have been given gifts and talents that we are to use. We would like to hear any comments, suggestions, or ideas that you have for our church and council meetings are a great opportunity to bring these forward.
