Lutheran Church Missouri Synod's Statement on Close Communion:

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, Our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but <u>His very body and blood to eat and drink</u> for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to first speak with the Pastor.

Teaching Points

Crucifix: A Middle English term derived from the Latin, meaning "fastened to a cross." A crucifix is a cross that bears the image of the crucified Christ, pointing to the reality of the One who came in the flesh to be the Savior of the world.

The Sacrament of the Altar, Part 2

What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?
These words, "Given and shed for the
forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament
forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through
these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there
is also life and
to the me that
How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?
Certainly not just eating and drinking do these things, but
the written here: "Given and shed for you for
the forgiveness of sins." These words, along with the
bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in the
Sacrament. Whoever these words has
exactly what they say: "forgiveness of sins."
exactly what they say. Torgiveness of sins.
Who receives this Sacrament worthily?
Fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine
training. But that person is truly worthy
and well prepared who has in these words:
"Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." But
anyone who does not believe these words or
them is unworthy and unprepared, for the words "for
you" require all hearts to believe.
