The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod's Statement on Close Communion:

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, Our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to first speak with the Pastor.

Teaching Points

Apostles' Creed Though not written by the apostles (a common assumption in the Middle Ages) the Apostles' Creed faithfully summarizes the apostolic teaching of Holy Scripture. Its origins date back to the second century where it developed as a statement of faith in conjunction with Holy Baptism. In most churches it is still used at every baptism

The Apostles' Creed – The First Article (Creation):

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, _____ of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

I believe that God has made me and all _____; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears and all my members, my reason and all my _____, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, _____ and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and _____ provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.

He defends me against all danger and _____ and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and _____, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to _____ and praise, serve and obey Him.
