St. John's VBS 2025 Recap

We had over 20 children ranging in ages 3 through those going into 6th grade. We had a wonderful group of over 10 youth helpers, and about 20 adult workers. We enjoyed learning about Jesus being the perfect Son so that we may be called children of the Father, reminding us that He loves us and that we are called to be His own. There was fellowship, activities, wonderful snacks,



creative crafts, singing, and a lot of fun. It is wonderful to see everyone working together, enjoying the craziness of all the children, and sharing God's love with the youngsters.

During our Bible lessons, we talked about "Jesus calls us" with Mose's story of exodus, "Jesus Leads Us" with Joshua leading the people through the Jordan River, "Jesus Teaches Us" with the parable of the good Samaritan, "Jesus Saves Us" as Peter and John raced to the empty tomb on Easter morning and "Jesus Sends Us" telling us to go and share His message.

Mission Fundraisers

This year we collected food for local area food pantries, Athens, Edgar, and Stratford. We collected **186 Food Items** during the week and the kids and staff delivered the grocery bags to the 3 local Circle of Joy drop offs at VBS closing on Friday. We focused on items needed the most: Canned Meats: (Chicken, Ham, Tuna, Spam) Canned Pasta with Meat, Canned Fruit, Cereal. All Nonperishable items were accepted.

Our second mission was Texas flood relief, in conjunction with Thrivent. Thrivent is matching donations for flood relief efforts, providing \$1 for every \$2 donated, up to \$250,000, to support those affected by the floods in Texas.

We collected over \$ 3,200 from VBS with the congregation's help!

With Thrivent's match of \$ 1,600 our total donation will be over \$ 4,800

We closed VBS with an evening church service on Friday, followed by a picnic style supper in the parish hall. The kids enjoyed showing off their new songs to families and friends.

They will be emailing and advertising in local churches and businesses. The bus leaves at 8 am and is back around 9 pm. The committee is working on scheduling a blood drive with the Red Cross.

Motion was made and seconded to accept all reports.

New business:

Discussed the new insurance premiums. Linda will look into seeing if the cemetery is covered.

Linda will be appointing a nominating committee soon.

A letter from the secretary was read and is included on the back side.

Voted and approved that birthday cards will be sent out to all parishioners starting 9/1/25

St. John Quarterly Voter's Meeting July 20, 2025

Linda called the meeting to order and opened with a prayer. The minutes of the January meeting was reviewed and approved.

Pastor's report was written and read to the assembly. Confirmation classes will begin again in September, with a tentative start date of the 10'th of September at St. John. Classes run from 6-7. First year students have a year of Bible review. Second and third year students study the Small Catechism with pastor. This year's class will cover some of the Creed, the Sacraments, the Lord's Prayer, & Confession.

Sunday morning Adult Bible classes begin on September 21st after both services.

Life-light Bible Study will begin on September 17'th and 18'th studying the book of Hebrews. Wednesday evenings will meet at 7pm at St. John and Thursday mornings will meet at 10:30am at Bethlehem. The cost for the books is \$10 this time because of a CPH sale.

The Fall Pastor's Conference is scheduled from October 20'th -22'nd in Eau Claire. Current shut-ins are Audrey Telschow, Burt Wolff, Bruce and Dory Wussow. Two funerals were held. Oscar Held and Selma Miessner.

Elders and Outreach had no reports.

Board of Education will have a dual meeting at the end of July. Sept. 14'th is rally day at Milan probably at the ball diamond.

The treasurer had a complete report.

The trustees are looking for snow plow bids. People considering putting in a bid must have their own liability insurance.

Motion was made to accept all reports as given. This was passed.

Unfinished business: The gift of \$5000 from Wisconsin Valley Lutheran was discussed. A motion was made to put 2/3 of the money toward the church renovation here at St John and 1/3 to Vicar Mroczenski's ministry fund. There was a second and it was accepted.

The new insurance company for the entire property had to be secured since Church Mutual made a steep increase in our premium and gave notice of a near future cancelation due to the age of our building. This company only does churches.

We will need to form a safety committee to meet the insurance requirements. Linda will appoint this committee.

A dual parish picnic will happen at Bethlehem Church with a 10am service. This will also commemorate Pastor's anniversary of ordination into the ministry.

New Business:

The plans for a full refresh and cleaning of the Sanctuary with repairs to ceiling and walls as needed was presented by the committee. Church Interiors Inc did a complete estimate including cleaning of the paintings, LED lights in the gothic style, and new wood around the baseboards. Stencils similar to what we have and the gold stencil will be cleaned and painted around. We are looking at a project of just under \$130,000. The company said we would be out of the sanctuary for 3 weeks. The assembly voted to accept the bid and move forward with the project.
