"Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven." (Luke 10:19-20)

In the Name of Jesus. Amen. Did you know that as believers, you have nothing to fear from Satan and his army of fallen angels? That is what Satan and, indeed, all demons are: fallen angels. Did you know that when you were clothed with Christ in Baptism, Satan lost any power or claim that he had on you? Did you know that because you have been marked as a child of God, demons actually fear you? This is not a matter of Christians being especially intimidating in a manly or warrior-like fashion. Indeed, Satan and his minions retain a special fear of women, for it was through a woman that God promised to bring forth the savior. Power and authority over demons- that is a pretty exciting thing, and it's a re ality for Christians. This needs to be kept in mind in the face of popular Chris tian fiction that depicts believers as helpless pawns in some ongoing cosmic battle between God's angels and Satan's angels. Not to spoil anyone's reading for entertainment, but the battle is over. It's not ongoing. As Revelation 12 reminds us, war broke out in heaven. Michael and his angels fought against the dragon, and the dragon and his angels fought back. But he was not strong enough, and they lost their place in heaven. This does not describe some future battle that we need to pick sides for but speaks of a past battle, one that is already over. Satan and God should never be seen as equals caught up in a struggle that we somehow can tip one way or the other. Satan needs to be seen for what he is defeated and cast down from heaven and trying to take anyone down with him that he can. As exciting as this is, power over Satan and his fallen angels isn't even the main thing. This is not why we gather for worship on a Sunday. We do not gather to celebrate our authority over Satan and his demons; we do not gather to impress each other with new and painful wrestling holds with which to torture them, although that might make for a popular youth activity. We gather, as always, to receive the forgiveness of sins that Christ won for us on the cross. We gather to receive God's Gi ts. We gather for the strengthening of faith. We gather because Jesus has called us. We gather because our names have been written in heaven. In the Name T of Jesus. Amen.

St. John: Oct. Quarterly Voters Meeting:

It has been increasingly difficult, over the past several years, finding candidates for our elected positions at St. John. Our Nominating Committee continues to work diligently to get volunteers for these offices.

As discussed at the last voters meeting a committee has reviewed the bylaws for the term limits, and will be making recommendations for changes at the next voters meeting.

Changes to discuss will include that a term will be 2 years instead of 3 years; but could now serve 3 consecutive terms (total of 6 years which has not changed).

They will also be recommending that the following statement be added to the Bylaws. " If an office has no candidate available, the person serving in that office may continue to serve a 1 year temporary extension with yearly voter approval until a new officer is elected

Some offices require a higher skill set then others, specifically the treasurers and Financial Secretary positions. If there are no candidates for these specific offices, we may have to look into the possibility of making this a paid position, and hire an outside source if needed.

We will also be discussing changing just the title Board of Evangelism to The Board of Outreach.
