From the Pastor's Desk

The season of Advent has arrived once again, and with it the time to prepare for the celebration of the arrival of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. One of the primary ways to prepare for that celebration is with an added time of worship each week on Wednesday. This special time of prayer and meditation is

offered either at 1:00pm at Bethlehem or at 7:00pm at St. John. God invites you to be an active part of His family by being in His House to hear His Word. It's a special invitation to come and receive the gifts that God has for you.

But we have so many good reasons not to accept this invitation. At least, we think they're good reasons. The demands of work to be done either at a job or just things around the house that seem so important. The schedule of running kids to one activity after another gets so overwhelming that one more thing just doesn't seem possible. The lack of energy after a long day makes going home for some quiet time seem so much more important. And the list can go on and on from there. It's amazing what we will make a priority over time spent worshipping our Lord and Savior either on a regular Sunday morning or at a special weekday service such as during this season of Advent.

The simple fact is that God wants you to take time out for Him. The 3rd Commandment is very clear, "Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy." These words are a clear instruction to remember to set time aside for God, who spends 24 hours a day, 7 days a week protecting and providing for you. This commandment calls faithful Christians to come and hear God's Word, and to hold it sacred, *gladly hearing and learning it*. God invites you here to be a part of His family, and to receive what gifts He has to give you.

And that's something that so many of us misunderstand about coming to worship. It isn't about what you are doing for God. It's all about what God wants to do *for you*! That's why our liturgy is called "Divine Service" because in it our Divine God is serving His people. God – the Creator of all things – wants to serve you!

In the Divine Service God comes to us, and He speaks to us through His Holy Word. He confronts us with our sin, and warns us about how dangerous it is to ignore our sin. But God doesn't just warn us about our sin. He also forgives it, and promises to forget about it completely once it's forgiven. God also encourages us with the Good News of His love, and He promises to give us the strength that we need to get through the challenges of life in this broken world. In addition to all of this, God also provides the banquet of Holy Communion for His faithful children, and with it provides even more forgiveness as He becomes a part of us in a very real and tangible way as we receive Christ's body and blood.

It can be hard to come back to God's House after you've been away for a while. We are creatures of habit, and once you're no longer in the habit of coming to worship, it can be difficult to start again. In addition to that difficulty is the thoughts and temptations that can get in the way of remembering God's desire to have us be in His House. The devil is really good at putting all kinds of questions and doubts into our head about whether or not God would really want us back with Him. The devil is good at it because he's had 1000's of years of practice in manipulating and tempting human beings.

That's why God has given us so many gifts, including the gift of His Word to assure us of His never-ending love and mercy. If you're not sure whether God will welcome you back as He says that He will, just consider this from Romans 8, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?... For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." *Hope to see you soon! – Pr. M.*
