FD-02	Dried Floral Arrangement <i>Made with dried flowers, grasses, seed pods, and natural materials.</i>
FD-03	Farmhouse Arrangement <i>Rustic design using farm materials, wildflowers, or country elements.</i>
FD-04	Miniature Arrangement <i>A small-scale floral arrangement.</i>
FD-05	Creative / Unique Design <i>Original design using any fresh, dried, or preserved materials.</i>
